



Islamabad, Kabul agree to reboot ties

• In one-on-one meeting with Afghan president, PM calls for qualitative transformation in relations
 • Ghani also meets Shabaz, Bilawal and Siraj

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan and Afghanistan on Thursday agreed to reboot their bilateral relations, which have remained mired in mistrust for long, by developing a "forward-looking vision" based on cooperation instead of political competition.

This consensus was reflected in a statement issued by the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) after Prime Minister Imran Khan's one-on-one meeting with Afghan President Ashraf Ghani at delegation level — talks between the two sides in which the state of relations was reviewed.

President Ghani is on a two-day visit to Pakistan. The visit is aimed at strengthening bilateral cooperation in political, trade, economic and security fields and forging stronger and multifaceted ties. The visit, moreover, taking place amid hopes of progress in US-Taliban talks leading to institution of intra-Afghan dialogue, and ahead of Afghan presidential elections scheduled for September.

Prime Minister Khan, during the meeting, called for "a qualitative transfor-

mation" in ties, whereas President Ghani, in his speech at the Institute of Strategic Studies Pakistan (ISSP), emphasised the need for developing "political alignment" between the two neighbours and taking "bold steps".

The agreement on improving relations apparently flows from realisation in both capitals that the two, likened by former Afghan president Hamid Karzai to conjoined twins, could not progress without positively engaging with each other.

President Ghani said Loya Jirga, the traditional Afghan consultative gathering, held last month had strengthened normal ties with Pakistan and said Pakistan remained committed to a peaceful, stable, democratic and prosperous Afghanistan. He expressed his government's desire to have stronger political, trade, economic, and people-to-people relations with Afghanistan.

Prime Minister Khan reaffirmed Pakistan's commitment to support the Afghan peace process and underlined that an Afghan-led and Afghan-owned peace process was the only viable option for sustainable peace. He said Pakistan supported a result-oriented intra-Afghan dialogue.

According to AP, the Pakistani official said having said: "While Afghanistan realises the importance of Pakistan in medium to long term, Pakistan also feels

Final version of budget to be shared with IMF by July 1

Govt expects NA to pass finance bill today

ISLAMABAD: The government is expecting final passage from the National Assembly of the Finance Bill 2019-20 on Friday (today), after which the next step will be the International Monetary Fund (IMF)'s final meeting, which is currently scheduled for July 3.

The final budget packages passed by the assembly along with a report on compliance with all prior-Social Media Pakistan 0345-6738227 requirements in the board's decision to grant Pakistan's request for accession to a \$6 billion bailout facility. The final, approved version of the

budget and finance bill are expected to be transmitted to the Fund by Monday, a senior government official familiar with the process told Dawn.

"The signing of all prior actions has given the way for the board meeting on third of July. Sharing of budget approved by the parliament was one of the prior actions," said a senior official of the ministry of finance on condition of not being named in view of the board meeting's sensitivity. He said the budget approval was the final step for Pakistan to determine the IMF's review. "The latest exchange rate, SBP policy rate, electricity and gas rates and minimum exchange rate" were the key prior actions, the official said.

Officials said the Memorandum of Economic and Financial Policies (MEFP) had already been transmitted to the IMF in line with the staff-level agreement reached on May 12. Pakistan will remain committed throughout the 29-month program to pursue what the Fund has called a "modest, diversified exchange rate". However, if at any stage the central bank comes across reasonable evidence to suggest artificial exchange rate manipulation by outside factors, it will be free to intervene, a senior official said.

Also, the State Bank of Pakistan will maintain the current gap between its policy rate and the rate of inflation along with the aim and in any circumstance the difference between policy rate and inflation would not be allowed to fall below 1.5pc. That would mean the policy rate will stay 1.5pc higher than

Govt distributes Rs175m among lawyers' bodies

ISLAMABAD: Amid growing pressure from lawyers over a reference against Justice Qazi Fazl Javed, Chief Justice Law Minister Dr Firdous Naseem on Thursday distributed Rs175 million of taxpayers' money among 132 bar associations to sit over their support.

The reference against Justice Ishaq is due for hearing by the Supreme Judicial Council (SJC) on July 2 when the Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA) plans to observe a "black day" across the country.

SCBA president Amanullah Khanam has given a call to representatives of different bar associations to observe a "black day" on July 2 when the five-member SJC will sit to hear the references against Justice Ishaq and Justice K. K. Agha of the Sindh High Court (SHC).

On Wednesday, the law minister held a meeting with Lahore District Bar Association president Atta Cheema who was accompanied by the newly elected legal adviser of the Capital Development Authority, Shabir Ghani.

In the past, the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) government through its law minister Dr Babar Awan had disbursed Rs75.4 million among 132 district bar associations when they had been facing tough judicial oversight throughout its term related to the National Reconciliation Ordinance and the reopening of the Swiss case against the then prime minister Asif Zardari.

The office of the Attorney General had raised objections over the payment which had been cleared by the Public Accounts Committee (PAC) led by Syed Khurshid Ahmed Shah of the PPP in 2016.

The Lahore District Bar Association announced lifetime membership for Mr Nasim and also invited him to visit the bar on July 10.

It may be mentioned that following the filing of a reference by the judges the Karachi Bar Association had suspended the membership of Mr Nasim.

The lawyers' bodies of Islamabad got a major break from Thursday's disbursement. The law ministry issued Rs5 million to the Islamabad High Court Bar Association (IHCBA) and Rs2.5 million to the District

Bar Association of Islamabad.

The bar associations had been demanding funds from the federal government for the past several months.

According to the Islamabad Bar Association, the association had demanded the demand for funding a couple of months ago and the ministry had issued them a cheque on Thursday.

Regarding the SCBA's call for observing the black day on July 2, he said the district bar would decide its course of action about it in its upcoming meeting.

The law minister claimed that the funding to different bar associations had been made in a transparent manner while keeping in view their needs and requirements.

Lawyers' welfare

The law minister while addressing representatives of different bar associations said that lawyers' welfare was among the top priorities of the incumbent government.

He said the caretaker government had raised certain restrictions over funding to the bar associations but the incumbent government believed it was necessary to maintain the independence of lawyers' bodies to empower them financially.

He recalled that "in previous the government being a representative of the bar struggled a lot to empower lawyers financially, but unfortunately my proposal was rejected".

The lawyers' community was not accommodated in the past; however the current government, despite financial crisis was distributing funds to the community transparently," he said adding that the opposition was questioning the funding to lawyers in the scheme and said that the opposition was a gigantic barrier to making legislation for public welfare in the parliament.

The minister said: "The opposition outside the Parliament and in the committees assure the masses of protecting the rights of people, but when no present any bill for people's betterment in the house, they do not let it pass".

He said that an increase in the number of judges in the Islamabad High Court was just for the welfare of the masses, but the opposition even after giving an assurance to the government rejected the bill in the Senate.

Mr Nasim said that the incumbent government distributed funds among the district bar associations and district bar councils without any political discrimination.

PM orders special campaign to check price hike

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Imran Khan on Thursday directed the provincial and federal authorities to launch a special campaign to check unprecedented hike in prices.

Presiding over a meeting here on Thursday, he asked the provincial governments, local administrations and the chief commissioners, Islamabad, Lahore, and Sargodha to conduct raids at wholesale markets.

Mr Khan said effective implementation of local and special laws concerning efficient service delivery and related to the general public was one of the prime responsibilities of the field administration.

The meeting observed that the lack of coordination

among various stakeholders, poor understanding/implementation and indifferent attitude had established a culture of corruption in these laws, thus increasing malpractices of the general public.

The prime minister said under the special campaign, a strategy would be devised by all concerned stakeholders to implement price control laws effectively from the wholesale markets to retail shops. He said the concerned authorities concerned should implement market control committees more effectively, besides taking strict action against the perpetrators under law.

He directed the authorities to develop a mechanism to check manipulations elements which charged disproportionate prices without sufficient cause, besides taking strict action against the offenders.

The meeting decided that the price control committee would notify the rates of essential commodities regularly and the same should be implemented effectively.

Wapda wins first stage of Tour de Khunjerab cycle race

GILGIT: The first stage of 'Tour de Khunjerab 2019' cycle race concluded on Thursday as 136 contestants pedalled 47 kilometers from Gilgit to the Rakaposhi base camp.

The cyclists are expected to arrive on Sunday at the highest placed international border between Pakistan and China at an altitude of 56,000 feet, covering a distance of 22 kilometers in four stages.

The first stage is from Gilgit city to Rakaposhi base camp of Nagar district. The second stage is from Rakaposhi base camp to Karimabad in Hunza, then at Skor and the race ends at Khunjerab pass.

The cycle race starts at 4,800 feet and reaches an altitude of 16,000 feet.

The international competition of the event was held on Thursday at Gilgit city park.

GB Chief Minister Haider Khan, Governor Rehman, Chief Secretary Khurram Shahzad Agha, GB Assembly Deputy Speaker Jaffarullah Khan, Tourism Minister Fida Khan and Minister Ahsanuzzaman and other officials attended the ceremony.

Speaking on the occasion, the GB chief minister said that the 'Tour de Khunjerab' cycle race had become an international event. The GB government, he said, would promote tourism and sport activities through such events.

He said that after completion of the Skardu-Gilgit road project, another cycle road project will be completed from Gilgit to Skardu every year to attract more tourists to Gilgit.

The 136 cyclists from 11 foreign and national teams participated in the competition. The national teams include Pakistan, India, Afghanistan, Nepal, POF, Web, and SSGC. Islamabad, Cyclists from Sri Lanka, Afghanistan, Iran and Switzerland are also participating in the race.

Jamal Wapda was declared winner of the first stage of the event.

Sugar Deputy Commissioner Hassan Rana Chaudhary said the race was the first of the first stage of the race.

He told reporters that winner Nejaveed from Wapda arrived Rakaposhi base camp Nagar district via Karakorum Highway crossings, covering 77km distance of the first stage of the race from Gilgit city, within two hours, one minute and 34 seconds.

Afzal Khan from Pakistan Army stood second and crossed the distance in two hours, one minute and 33 seconds. Yousaf Rameez from Sri Lanka crossed the distance in two hours, two minutes and 34 seconds and finished third.

The second stage of the race will start on Friday morning from Rakaposhi base camp to Karimabad.

In a video statement released by the National Emergency Operations Centre (NEOC), Prime Minister's

Federal Persons Polio Ballo Ben Attah has appealed to parents to vaccinate their children and avoid propaganda.

The Federal public directorate urged miscreants who due to which propagation of far-flung areas of KP are still reluctant to vaccinate their children. Parents should be aware that there is no care for polio once the damage is done," Mr Afridi said.

Fortunately, children who are vaccinated against polio multiple times are able to fight the virus back. The more doses of the polio vaccine a child receives, the higher the chances of escaping lifelong paralysis," said Mr Afridi.

It is worth mentioning that Pakistan remains to be one of the two last countries in the world, alongside Afghanistan, where polio virus continues to circulate. So far in 2019, a total of 32 polio cases have been reported, including 26 from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and tribal districts, three from Punjab and three from Sindh.

Omni group bosses move court for acquittal in fake accounts case

ISLAMABAD: Directors of the Omni group on Thursday filed applications in the accountability court seeking acquittal in the fake bank accounts case, the National Accountability Bureau (NAB) sought time to respond to these pleas.

Omni Group's directors filed the applications seeking acquittal under section 265-K of the Criminal Procedure Code.

The judge remanded that it was too early to seek response. The remand on the case will expire on the 10th of June, the National Accountability Bureau (NAB) sought time to respond to these pleas.

When the judge inquired from NAB, the prosecutor sought time from the court to file a reply to the acquittal application.

During the proceedings, under-evidentiary Abid Ghani Majrood requested the court to order NAB to provide him

proper medical facilities.

The judge

reminded that why should he ask NAB to shift their office to a hospital.

He said that every other accused suffered from multiple diseases after he was taken into custody.

Former prosecutor Asif Ali Zardari appeared before the court and said that he was not among those co-accused, adding: "I remained behind bars in solitary confinement for 13 long years and was never afraid of imprisonment."

He requested the court to direct NAB to remove handcuffs from the aged accused, saying that they were well-educated people and never indulged in any anti-state activities.

The judge adjourned further proceedings of the case till July 8.

Statue of Ranjit Singh unveiled on his 180th death anniversary

LAHORE: In a colourful ceremony, the statue of the Sikh ruler Maharaja Ranjit Singh was unveiled at the Lahore Fort, at the Mai Jindha's Havelli, on Thursday evening. The nine-foot tall statue, made of cold bronze, shows the royal Sikh emperor sitting on a horse, sword in hand, complete in Sikh attire.

The unveiling ceremony was highly highlighted by some daring 'gatka' performances, of Sikh martial arts, where young boys displayed the different styles of attacking and sparring with various tools, including sticks, a spiked ball and chain, and other weapons.

The performances showed how a skilfully-trained warrior could manage to do the most during fights, such as in the

display of this skill, the stick or gatka-wielding warrior easily broke earthen pots, and coconuts balanced on others' heads, while two expert warriors sparred inside a circle of fire.

At the occasion were several Sikh delegates from India, Pakistan and also overseas. The event was organised by Bobby Singh Bassal, from the UK, in collaboration with the Walled City of Lahore Authority.

There were also guests and descendants of the Golden Temple Gurchari situated outside the walls of the fort.

"As you know, religious tourism is one of the main themes of our government," he said. "Both the Kartarpur Corridor and Nankana Sahib will get a lot of attention in this context. Likewise, the Ranjit Singh statue is also in line with the government's focus on religious tourism, particularly Sikh religion tourism."

"It was not appropriate that the statue was being installed in Lahore, from where Ranjit Singh ruled over Punjab from 1803-05."

"There is a great deal of Sikh heritage in and around Lahore Fort, including the Ranjit Singh samadhi, and the Gurdwara Panja Sahib. We also have a Sikh Gallery inside the Lahore Fort," he said.

The statue is expected to be the highlight that follows the Ranjit Singh samadhi and the Gurdwara Deva Sahib of Guru Arjan Dev. The havelli, named

after Ranjit Singh's youngest queen, now houses a permanent exhibition of Sikh artefacts and is called the Sikh Gallery.

More than 400 Sikh pilgrims arrived in Lahore from India on Thursday afternoon to mark the 180th death anniversary of Maharaja Ranjit Singh. The main ceremony will be held in Lahore's Walled City on July 28. The pilgrims came from Wagah Railway Station through a special train of Pakistan Railways at about 9am.

"We are really grateful to Pakistan for issuing visas to a number of applicants seeking to attend the 10-day-long event. It is a matter of great pleasure for us," Sardar Naseer Singh told journalists at Lahore's Sialkot railway station.

"With concerted efforts formulate the policies that can create harmony among the people," said Sardar Harpal Singh.

Four die in rain-related incidents

TOBA TEK SINGH: A farmer died when the wall of his house fell on him during heavy winds followed by rain on Wednesday night at Karamla.

Windstorm also uprooted hundreds of trees and several electricity poles at different places due to which electricity supply remained suspended in some rural areas for more than 12 hours.

The police said deceased farmer Nasir Ahmed (40) was injured critically when the mud wall fell on him. He was rushed to the Karamla Tehsil Headquarters Hospital where he succumbed to his wounds on Thursday. He belonged to Chak Mohawala.

Minor girl Aliya was injured and shifted to the Okara District Headquarters Hospital.

In another incident in village 33/2RA on Okara-Faisalabad Road, a family of five people was buried under roof debris.

Villagers rescued Younis, his wife Sheenam Bibi and three children minors who were later shifted to the hospital by Rescue 1122.

'Shahbaz govt signed expensive contract'

LAHORE: Health Minister Dr Yasmeen Rashid says the previous Punjab government signed a memorandum of understanding with the Modicare company of 20 mobile health units and Rs 2.5 billion were monthly expenses of one mobile health unit, according to the contract.

Japanese airline wants to start flights to Islamabad: envoy

The ASA stipulates single airline designation with PIA being the designated airline of Pakistan and Japan Airlines being the designated carrier of Japan.

The minister thanked the ambassador for Japan's help through Japan International Cooperation Agency (Jica) for Airport Security Force and Pakistan Meteorological Department.

The minister said ASA may be provided institutional-based technical training for the equipment. He also asked the ambassador for reducing the time span between planning stage for and executing the equipment's provision by Jica. — Staff Reporter

Maryam raps govt for disallowing visitors to Nawaz in jail

LAHORE: Claiming that incarcerated Nawaz Sharif is suffering from recurring angina attacks, the ousted premier's daughter Maryam Nawaz says that only a limited number of visitors are being allowed to meet her father in jail.

In a series of tweets about her father's physical and country's economic health on Thursday, she said that after his recurring angina, Nawaz Sharif's health was not being allowed access to him.

"Despite recurring angina, MNS cardiologist is not being given access to him. Even today he was made to wait outside jail for 2 hours & sent back without meeting Sharif on bail-in-Awan."

On Thursday, the day allocated for visiting inmates at the Kot

Lakhpur Jail where Mr Sharif is serving his term in a corruption case, only five close relatives, including Maryam, were permitted to visit the ex-premier.

She protested that even the few meetings she had with her father were also strictly monitored in violation of the basic human rights and hinted at street agitation on the issue.

"Today only 5 members (close blood relatives) were allowed to meet PMIS, there were too many strict monitoring. This is violation of basic human rights. I am NOT going to be a passive spectator, beware."

She said this in response to a report by one of her Twitter followers in which it was suggested that Maryam should stage a sit-in outside the Kot Lakhpur Jail till personal physician of Nawaz Sharif was allowed to visit him.

"Now such a step seems imminent," Maryam added.

She said if the "main" government didn't allow Mian Aslam, a doctor to meet him and if God forbid the disease aggravated, then hundreds of millions of voters of the PML-N should know who is to be held responsible for it.

The PML-N vice-president sees the denial of medical facilities to her father as political victimisation under direct supervision of Prime Minister Imran Khan after the recent social media-induced income generation.

The victimisation increases as businessmen vocal, Jaddi-e-Awan is directly monitoring this. Would have been better if he had focused his energies on the striking economy instead of Sharif family. What a pretty, spineless man!"

AJK assembly passes Rs121.56 billion budget

House approves 32 demands for grant in absence of opposition members

MUZAFFARABAD: The AJK Legislative Assembly on Thursday passed the budget for 2019-20 amounting to Re21.56 billion, including Re1.57 billion for securing expenditures and Re4.8 billion for developmental activities.

Finance Minister Dr Naqeeb Naqvi presented a total of 32 demands for grant which were unanimously approved by the treasury benches in the absence of the opposition.

Many of the 11 opposition lawmakers had opted to stay away from the budget session for one or the other reason and the few who were present also staged a walkout on a trivial issue at the time of presentation of demands for grant.

Official sources claimed that the opposition lawmakers avoided moving out motions after the government agreed to some of their demands regard-

ing allocation of development funds for their constituencies at their discretion.

The house also decided to approve the revised budget for 2019-20 amounting to Re140.175 billion, including Rs 22.275 billion for developmental activities and Re86.9 billion for securing expenditures.

Besides, demands for grant for the additional expenditures beyond the approved budget for the fiscal years 2015-16 to 2017-18 were also approved.

Earlier, speaking on the floor of the house, Prime Minister Raja Farooq Haider and the opposition could have played a better role by giving its support to the current year's budget if it had not opposed the opening.

Claiming that he had lived an honest and clean life, he asked Speaker Shah Ghulam Qadir to constitute a committee of the house to look into an investigation team to probe his resources.

"Unlike other providers, I am not claiming rent of my personal assets. I don't have any personal vehicle and I am ready to be dragged on the streets from Maslakhata to Mirpur if corruption of a penny in private account meets," he said, asking the committee to look into their personal conduct.

He asserted that he did not believe in victimisation and earnestly wanted to make the account-

ability process more transparent.

"If I believed in victimisation, many opposition leaders would either have landed in jails or would have been killed."

Mr Haider and his team satisfied that most of the pledges his party had made before the 2016 elections to AJK had been met.

"We are striving to fulfil the remaining commitments and will be successful in it long before the end of our constitutional term."

Expressing gratitude to former premiers Nawaz Sharif and Shahid Khaqan Abbasi for providing adequate resources to AJK, he said he also held Inam Khan in high esteem as prime minister of Pakistan.

"I have also told him plainly that my leader is Nawaz Sharif and I cannot compromise on it."

He said he was grateful to PM Khan for giving clear directions for resolution of the problems caused by Neelum Jhelum and Mangla power projects.

He paid tribute to his team for increase in revenue receipts.

"While in Pakistan, the revenue targets could not be met, here we generated more income than our target which speaks itself for the efficiency of my team."

Later, the chair prorogued the session sine die.

'Budget will have disastrous consequences for middle class'

ISLAMABAD: Experts at a seminar said the federal budget 2019-20 and the government's state function policy will have disastrous consequences for Pakistan's middle income class which is expected to face a 40% compression in disposable income as taxes, inflation.

The meeting of the Authority for Strategic Planning, the think tank on development and pro-poor growth, was held at Jinnah Institute.

Former member of the prime minister's economic advisory council, Sabir Sherani said the

rising current account deficit and an overvalued rupee had resulted in a debt trap.

He said overvaluation of the rupee over the last five years meant that Pakistan ran a huge current account deficit, the largest in all emerging markets.

He said the rupee had been falling because external financing was over \$23 billion in 2018. This already was too much for Pakistan from the same currency crisis at the moment is therefore pursuing stabilisation," he added.

He said Pakistan's exports were not only the lowest among all emerging markets at 8 per cent

but also continued to decline.

Dr Faizan Ishaq, academic and member of the Economic Advisory Council, said the government was underestimating the consequences of the budget 2019-20.

"Jobs are vanishing, inflation is hitting people very hard and utility prices are pushing people in debt," he said adding: "There is absolutely no guarantee that these stabilisation measures will yield any benefits or lead to a growth path."

He said Pakistan needed over seven per cent sustainable growth but there was no vision for growth.

Another member of the council, Dr

Iqbal Nabi, said economic structural problems created its monetary growth pattern, regular sterilised injections and other monetary stabilisation.

Dr Nabi recalled moments in Pakistan's economic history where the rupee had crashed but the economy found other ways of bouncing back.

"But without addressing socio-economic fundamentals such as gross savings, investment and exports, there is little chance that governments will be able to break out of the stabilisation-hyperinflation rut that they find themselves in," Dr Nabi said.

Hamza's 'frontman' gets bail

LAHORE: The Lahore High Court on Thursday granted bail to Mushtaq Cheent, an alleged front man of Leader of the Opposition in Punjab Assembly Hamza Shahbaz and his brother Salman Shahbaz, in a money laundering case instituted by the National Accountability Bureau (NAB).

Representing the bail petition of Mr Cheent before a two-judge bench, Advocate Asad Mansoor Butt argued that his client had turned approver in the case against Hamza and Salman and recorded his confession statement before the judicial magistrate concerned. Later, the trial court sent the petitioner to jail on judicial remand.

The counsel said the NAB no more required the petitioner in the case and keeping him behind the bars would serve no purpose. Therefore, he asked the court to release the petitioner.

NAB prosecutor told the bench that the prosecution would face an objection if the petitioner was released on bail.

The bench comprising Justice Ali Saeed Naqvi and Justice Sardar Ahmad Nasim allowed the petition and granted bail to Cheent and his brother.

The appellee said he had been working for the two brothers since they started looking after their family business of sugar in 2005.

He said he was a wholesale dealer for Ramzan Sugar Mills and that Hamza and Salman used to receive foreign remittances through bank accounts of his company — Mashaq & Co.

The NAB alleged that Mr Hamza maintained various accounts in different banks in which credit turnover of Re500 million was observed from 2006 to 2017.

It further alleged that Hamza received fictitious foreign remittances of Re500 million in one of his bank accounts, Re2.31 million in one in the accounts of his brother, Salmat, and Nasir, business partners and employees of these companies.

Mr Hamza is on physical remand with the NAB in two cases — Ramzan Sugar Mills and assets beyond accountability laundering while Salman is out of custody.

In the mill's case, the bench alleged that their chief minister Shahbaz Sharif approved construction of a dam in Chiniot at a cost of Re500m only to benefit Ramzan Sugar Mills owned by his son Hamza and Salman.

It said public funds were misappropriated for the benefit of the family business of the accused.

Girl's parents wanted to brief media on their reservations about investigation into the abduction, murder case

ISLAMABAD: The family of the 10-year-old girl, abducted and murdered in the capital last month, was allegedly taken away by the capital police on Thursday to prevent them from holding a press conference.

Farishta went missing from outside her home in Attock on May 15. Four days later, her decomposed body was recovered from Tamana village.

A man booked the National Press Club for a press conference on June 27 and the club administration invited mediapersons to cover the event.

The invitation by the press club said the family of the girl along with their counsel would hold a press conference at 3pm about the abduction and murder case.

However, later the man called the press club and cancelled the news conference.

When contacted by Dawn, the man introduced himself as Nadeem Khan, a native of Mohmand Agency.

"On the request of the girl's family I had booked the press club for a news conference. The family and I shall from Mohmand Agency speak to each other.

He said the news conference was scheduled in the afternoon and officials of the capital police reached the house of the family

and took away the deceased girl's parents and a brother to prevent them from speaking to the media.

"As they did not return till the afternoon, I cancelled the press conference," he said, adding that the arrangement was not violated.

Garrison officials had reached an agreement with the family when the latter held a protest after the murder, promising strict action against police officials for delaying registration of the case when the girl went missing. So far a case has been registered against only two police officials but action is yet to be taken against anyone, he added.

Besides repeated attempts, police spokesman Khalid Awan could not be contacted for his comments.

The inspector general of the police (IGP) was also not approachable.

Other officials in the police public relations office were also contacted but they refused to speak on record.

However, two senior police officers told Dawn: "If you want to talk to the girl's father, we can call him on the line."

The officers said "Check with verify the relation and status of the man who booked the press club for a press conference and dig out his motive too."

An official at the Shahzad Town police said they had not picked the family while the CMA also expressed ignorance about the matter.

The investigators conducted a polygraph on the suspect and collected samples for his DNA test, an officer said.

The police had met the family to brief them about the progress on the investigation.

Not violated code of conduct, PM tells ECP

Reply to notice says Imran visited Ghoutki only to condole death of Ali Mohammad Malaik

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Imran Khan on Thursday said that he had not violated the election's code of conduct by visiting Ghoutki to condole the death of a member of his cabinet.

"Our client (the prime minister) has not participated in any political programme or a meeting/rally nor he made any political statement (or) press talk which is proof of the fact that Pakistan Telecommunications Authority (PTA) had violated the laws and code of conduct," an appeal submitted by the prime minister through his counsel Babar Awan to a notice issued to him by the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) for alleged violation of the code of conduct by visiting Ghoutki ahead of the by-election in NA-205 (Ghoutki) which is scheduled for July 15.

The written response to the notice was submitted by former federal minister Babar Awan who met ECP secretary general Tariq Mumtaz here on Thursday.

The reply noted that Para 17(i) of the ECP's code of conduct forbids parliamentarians and public office holders from participating in the election campaign in any manner after the announcement of the schedule, but it "does not bar religious visit for condolence" and the prime minister "has not participated in the election campaign in any manner whatsoever."

The reply termed as "calculated and baseless" the complaint filed by a candidate against the prime minister's visit, alleging that the candidate was attempting to "illegally influence the elec-

tions campaign in his favour by bringing the name of prime minister of Pakistan in the local dirty politics of his party".

It has been pointed out in the notice that it was a "matter of public record" that a member of the federal cabinet, minister for narcotics control, Ali Mohammad Malaik, had passed away and the prime minister had visited his family in Ghoutki on June 19 to extend the minister's demise.

It was Mr Malaik's death which had necessitated the by-election for the NA-205 seat.

It says that the prime minister had not participated in any political programme or a meeting or rally, nor did he make any political statement or give a press talk. "A bare perusal of the para 17 (part-B) of the code of conduct it becomes clear that the above case notified dated 03-06-2019 is misconceived and has been issued without any legal justification and reason," it added.

The premier's counsel requested the ECP to withdraw the show cause notice issued to his client for being "misconceived and without any legal justification and reason".

According to the reply, PM Khan reserves the right to file a complaint for the initiation of proceedings against the complainant "for violating the code of conduct".

The candidate had pointed out that PM Khan's visit to Ghoutki was in violation of ECP's code of conduct as the schedule for the by-election had already been notified.

In the show cause notice, the prime minister was given one week time to submit a reply in the matter.

Security state

Winding up the debate on the controversial motion for grants for the defence division and its armed forces, Federal Minister of Interior retired Brig Shaukat declared Pakistan a "Security state".

The minister quoted an Indian scholar and a leader of Indian National Congress of pre-independence era, Abul Kalam Azad, who had stated that "Pakistan will become a security state instead of a welfare state".

The minister said seeing the prevailing security situation in the country, it seemed that Mr Asad had written these lines "last month while sitting in one of the chambers of the assembly".

Last month, the interior minister, who had served as the head of the civilian spy agency Intelligence Bureau during the military rule of Gen Pervez Musharraf, had made similar remarks during a meeting of the parliamentary committee.

The National Assembly is expected to approve the budget on Friday (today).

On Tuesday, while talking to a private news channel he had reiterated that the deadline would not be extended and urged that the government would have to either extend it to pursue the tax evaders if they failed to benefit from the scheme.

The government's tax amnesty scheme is aimed at whitening of undisclosed sales and assets, including foreign assets, at nominal tax rates. It was approved by the cabinet after much deliberation and was announced by Mr Shaikh.

In a video message on May 30, the prime minister had said the scheme was a "chance for [the people] to declare their hidden properties and bank accounts so they could become part of the tax net. He insisted that only one per cent of Pakistanis paid taxes. "No country can serve its people if its citizens don't pay taxes."

PM moves court for dismissal of disqualification petition

Claims plea not maintainable

PESHAWAR: Prime Minister Imran Khan has filed an application with the Peshawar High Court requesting to dismiss a petition which seeks his disqualification from holding any public office on multiple grounds.

The application said the petition was not maintainable and it deserved dismissal summarily.

It added that the petitioner had concealed the Supreme Court's declaration, which declared the applicant, Imran Khan, valid and annex under Articles 62 and 63 of the Constitution.

The petition was filed last year by PML-N Assembly candidate NA-35 Balochistan's Ishaq Khan, who is a leader of Pakistan Justice and Democratic Party of former chief justice of Pakistan Iftikhar Mohammad Chaudhary.

A bench consisting of Justice Ibraheemullah Khan and Justice Mousarrat Hifidi on Thursday directed the petitioner to respond to the application filed on behalf of Mr Ishaq.

The case was adjourned to the date to be fixed later.

The petitioner has claimed that during the last year general elections, Mr Imran had neither mentioned the name of his alleged daughter in his nomination papers nor he had disclosed the assets of his wife.

Mohammad Iftab Qureshi sub-

mited the application on behalf of senior lawyer Riaz Anwar, who is his legal counsel for Imran Khan.

The petitioner claimed that the petition was meant for blackmailing and suppressed facts, so it amounted to perjury for which he reserved the right to initiate proper proceedings against the petitioner under the relevant provisions of civil, defamatory and criminal laws.

He said in the petition was against the judgment of the election officer before elections and that the electoral laws, which provided remedies against pre-election grievances, weren't available by the petitioner, so the petition should be dismissed.

The applicant said Article 225 of the Constitution read with section 235 of the Elections Act cen-

tred remedies about pre-election and post-election stages, which were never restored to the petitioner and in the presence of sufficient alternate remedies, discretionary constitutional jurisdiction of the high court could not be invoked.

He said the Supreme Court, after a detailed scrutiny of the assets of the applicant and other allied issues, declared Imran Khan valid and annex under Article 62 of the Constitution.

The applicant said the petition was a blatant contempt of the Supreme Court judgment, as it merited dismissal summarily.

The petitioner conceded that Imran Khan had concealed important facts in his nomination papers and therefore, he was not righteous and vagueness in terms of Article 62 and 63 of the Constitution.

He said the petitioner had raised important objections before the returning officer in the said constituency who had rejected the name and accepted nomination papers of Imran Khan.

The petitioner said he had annexed important documents, including judgments of US courts regarding the Sita White case, which proved that the latter was daughter of Mr Imran.

He added Mr Imran had also concealed the property of his wife, Bushra Bibi, in the nomination papers.

The petitioner said the worth of the premier's Banigala mansion was declared Rs11.4 million, which was below its actual value and that even at the time of its purchase, the land's price was around Rs50 million.

KP Assembly concludes discussion on Rs28bn supplementary budget

Opposition calls for end to re-appropriation of uplift funds

PESHAWAR: The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Assembly on Thursday concluded discussions on the Rs27.02 billion worth of supplementary budget for the financial year 2018-19 amid the opposition's call for end to the re-appropriation of development funds from one area to another.

The opposition members said the ruling Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf presented its seventh budget in the province but the presentation of supplementary budget exposed its so-called financial mismanagement and discipline.

Deputy Speaker Mahmood Khan chaired the sitting.

Starting debate on the supplementary budget, Awami National Party MPA Shaukat Bashir Khan wondered if financial matters headed in the right direction, then why the government presented the supplementary budget.

He said the PTI had been talking about financial discipline and good governance in the province for the last seven years but despite that, supplementary budget was presented.

MPA Shegata Malik said the

speaker on one hand claimed to have used Rs10 million through community resources but on the other, Rs45 million had been given away to the assembly secretary in the supplementary budget.

She said the practice of re-appropriation of development funds should end for good.

Opposing the supplementary budget, Asimullah Khan advocate of the chair's ruling about whether the amount was supplementary or excess grant.

The chair referred that power of order to minister for law and parliamentary affairs Sultan Mohammad Khan for response.

The minister said Article 124 of the Constitution authorised the provincial government to present supplementary budget in excess grant.

He said the speaker had given a ruling on the matter last year, so there was no justification for fresh ruling.

The minister claimed the lawyer-complainant for challenging parliamentary matters in the court saying judiciary and parliament have separate mandates.

Murad Ali Majlis-i-Aam member Ishaqzai Khan expressed displeasure at the application of "garibani" by Speaker Mustaq Ahmad Ghani to kill debate on demands for grant.

He said the speaker violated parliamentary norms by exercising power

in absence of the opposition members to prevent debate on the demands for grant.

The MPA said the government needed supplementary budget to divert funds from one constituency to another constituency.

PTI MPA Nasir Ahmad Abbasi demanded of the government to reconstruct school buildings in Haro, Mingora, which were destroyed by the 2005 earthquake.

He said over 1,000 schools and other facilities had yet to be reconstructed.

Salehuddin Muhsin of the ASP said the work launched by Peshawar Development Authority on 15 km roads in his constituency had long been awaiting completion.

He complained that the government had allocated only Rs10,000 for basic health unit in Aukhdi area of Peshawar.

Local government minister Shahzad Khan Tarakai in his concluding speech said the successive government had presented supplementary budgets.

He disputed the impression that supplementary budget was unconstitutional. The minister said the first task of the university was being established in KP.

He said the deficiency of medicines in hospitals would be addressed.

Growers oppose massive cut in tobacco tax

PESHAWAR: The growers have opposed massive cut in the advance tax on tobacco insisting the government's move will encourage the black marketing of the cash crop and harm economy.

They demanded immediate withdrawal of the decision to prevent their economic murder.

The government has announced the reverting of the Rs300 per kg advance Federal Excise Duty on tobacco imposed to check the illegal tobacco trade to Rs10 per kg.

Addressing a news conference at the Peshawar Press Club on Thursday, local tobacco farmer Abdul Qayyum said massive cut to the advance tax on tobacco would promote the illicit tobacco trade and hurt poor growers.

Accompanied by farmers Ali Ahmad and Gulzar Khan, he criticised the government for yielding to tax evaders. He said the tobacco sector could earn huge revenue through the Rs10/kg advance tax.

Abdul Qayyum and other growers claimed that the collection of advance tax on tobacco was exploitation and the demand for tobacco would decrease due to the imposition of the admissible excise duty.

He said the Pakistan Tobacco Board Ordinance, 1964, protected tobacco growers and made it binding for tobacco manufacturing companies to purchase additional tobacco yield from growers.

Ali Ahmad said the farmers' associations were being encouraged by the government for withdrawing steps to control illegal trade to help the growth of tobacco.

Illegal growers were being exploited by the local cigarette manufacturers since the levy not only forced them to pay the adjustable tax on processed leaf but also

the non-adjustable excise duty.

KTH acting MD removed for misuse of powers

PESHAWAR: The provincial government has removed Dr Mohammad Shoaib, acting medical director of the Medical Teaching Institution Khyber Teaching Hospital (KTH), for alleged misuse of powers.

He has been replaced by Prof Irshad Ahmed, head of child health department, KTH, according to a notification issued by the Board of Governors on Thursday.

Dr Shoaib, an orthopaedic surgeon, was made acting MD after resignation of Prof Rohul Muqim, a laparoscopic general surgeon, as he had refused to oblige political people in unlawful appointments.

Dr Shoaib has been removed allegedly on charges of misuse of powers, in an emergency meeting of BoG held on Thursday, according to the sources.

At the time of his appointment, the health department had claimed that the hospital would show improvement within three months, but the situation deteriorated as consultation fee at the ISP was raised from Rs600 to Rs1,000.

The sources claimed that he was bypassing the BoG in important decisions due to which prompt action was taken against him.

KTH spokesman Farhad said that a new MD had been appointed as the board wanted to improve the patient care and take decisions accordingly.

Unimpressive MPC

THE opposition's multiparty conference in the capital on Wednesday proved nothing more than yet another exercise in rhetoric, with politicians once more announcing a rallying point in the future. This time they resolved to observe a 'black day' on July 25 — the first anniversary of the 2018 general elections — to protest against the alleged rigging during the polls. At a press briefing after the conference, political leaders from the country's main opposition parties sat together to reveal the opposition's 'strategy'. Stalwarts Maulana Fazlur Rehman, Shahbaz Sharif, Mahmood Khan Achakzai and Younis Raza Gilani shared the stage with scions Maryam Nawaz and Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari. Together, they presented a smorgasbord of ideas ranging from the removal of Sadiq Sanjrani as Senate chairman, to the formation of a committee to implement the MPC's decisions. The parties also reiterated their rejection of the 2019-2020 federal budget and the government's proposed National Economic Council and debt inquiry commission.

This week's meeting marked the third time the opposition parties sat together to discuss politics and a joint course of action — a strategy that is yet to materialise despite efforts to build momentum. Their very first congregation held during Ramazan, at the invitation of Mr Bhutto-Zardari, saw them discuss the political situation and contemplate a future mode of protest. A follow-up invitation from Ms Nawaz to Rawalpindi, too, saw the leaders discussing everything from the judges' references to the government's economic policies; the meeting ended with a pledge to agree on a joint course of action. The latest gathering has resulted in a similar announcement of a 'mass contact campaign' to mobilise the people against government policies — a sign that these meetings are actually quite hollow when it comes to substance. Evidently, the opposition's get-togethers have failed to yield concrete plans or create a sense of hope among the people suffering the consequences of a spiralling economy. With no clear strategy in view, it seems that the opposition is sitting together simply because political parties have common reservations about the ongoing accountability process. With Nawaz Sharif in jail and Asif Zardari in NAB custody, the PML-N and PPP appear to be actually avoiding a tangible plan — perhaps there is also concern that they may not be able to draw the crowds. Be that as it may, it is telling that these political figures do not seem to be able to offer a coherent plan even after numerous meet-ups.

Undoubtedly, the main role of opposition parties is to question the government of the day and challenge its policies in the interest of the public. In this spirit, the unity of the opposition and its meetings are intrinsic to forming a strategy. But alas for our opposition parties, despite the assembly of heavyweights under one roof, the outcomes of after-dinner meetings and hotel huddles have been rather anti-climactic.

Rupee slides

As the slides in the rupee continue unabated, some important questions are now coming to the fore. It is true that artificially holding the exchange rate at a level dictated by the political bosses makes for bad economic policy. But now that we are supposedly moving away from that regime towards what the State Bank calls a 'market-determined' rate, it is important to keep an eye on the volatility and ask whether the recent moves are indeed being determined by the market. Why is it that the exchange rate starts to see sharp slides just as an important IMF-related decision point approaches? The last slides happened when the staff-level agreement was coming up, and now that the board approval is due on July 3, we are again seeing sharp downward movements. There may not be anything to this, but it is worth bearing in mind that not so long ago the State Bank itself was telling us that the new level of the exchange rate is more in line with economic fundamentals. What fundamentals have changed since then to merit the more recent depreciations of the last few days?

There will no doubt be a public clamour for more stability in the exchange rate because it is central to the business operations of a large part of the country's services economy as well as manufacturing. Planning for the future is difficult in the face of sharp exchange rate swings that come like bolts of lightning from time to time. Now that the regime is moving towards greater flexibility and the new State Bank governor has retained some space for himself to intervene in the exchange rate markets, a great deal of concern is revolving around how and when that intervention might be triggered. It might not be possible to say what level the rupee is headed for in the months to come given the prevailing market-related uncertainties. But there is still a clear need for more communication on the direction of the exchange rate, or else the uncertainty may lead the wheels of the economy to grind to a halt. If there has been no commitment with the IMF on the value of the exchange rate, then more needs to be made clear, particularly what 'market determined' actually means. But if, contrary to official assertions, a value has indeed been agreed upon, the authorities should note that this fact will soon become impossible to conceal.

Time up for 'shoppers'?

SOMETIMES old ways of doing things were better for the collective good. Using cloth bags instead of plastic ones is among those; the ubiquitous 'shopper' blights the country's landscape — snagged on branches, littering the ground and choking drains. In late April, the local administration banned the export, import, purchase and use of plastic bags in Hunza, reportedly the first district in South Asia to put the environmentally friendly measure into effect. The administration distributed 1,000 such bags among the residents of the scenic valley to encourage them to switch to cloth bags, and carried out awareness-raising activities about plastic waste pollution. These efforts demonstrated commitment; without taking the public on board, the ban would have been difficult to enforce or sustain.

Hunza attracts huge numbers of domestic tourists every year, and is touted among the top destinations for wooing international travellers to Pakistan. That is another reason why the ban in this area is so important: nothing defines a stunning landscape as do 'shoppers' scattered about. Encouragingly, however, similar bans have recently been announced by the provincial governments as well in order to curb plastic waste pollution. Local administrations must ensure the restriction on non-biodegradable shopping bags is strictly observed — the country produces some 30m tonnes of solid waste annually, of which an estimated 9pc are plastics, including polythene bags. There will be some murmurs of discontent of course — from consumers because 'shoppers' have been a staple for so long, and from producers who will lose a steady stream of revenue. The country's largest city, Karachi, generates around 20,000 tonnes of solid waste daily but, shamefully enough, the authorities make no effort at waste collection. Nevertheless, this has not stopped the provincial government from repeatedly announcing a ban on polythene bags — empty words in the absence of follow-up action. Aside from clogging waterways that are the principal cause of urban flooding, the plastic waste that goes into the sea also endangers marine life. We must demonstrate far better civic sense.

Hard times & little hope

Javed has never received any help from the state, nor does he expect any.

JAVED works as a driver. His monthly salary is Rs20,000. He and his wife have four children and his father to support. Three of them live in a separate house. He is lucky that his wife has a job so there is no rent to pay. His two older children work and make another Rs20,000 between them. He is trying his best to keep the two younger ones in school. His elder ones could not continue beyond middle school.

Life is hard and, though Javed has a very strong belief in God and destiny, he is not very hopeful that his lot is going to change in the near future. But he does hope that, if his younger children get educated, they may be able to earn more.

He is able to make ends meet with the Rs40,000 that the family earns. But it is unanticipated costs that make life hard. His 20-year-old father fell ill a couple of months ago. In the developed world, on average, he would still be in relatively good health. In Pakistan, he is already pushing the life expectancy average. His diabetes and heart issues landed him in hospital for a week, which put Javed in debt. He has not yet been able to pay his employer back.

A few months back, the bills in gas bills forced Javed to sell his bicycle to his friends. Last month, it was the electricity bill that played havoc with his budget. His accumulated debts are now starting to bother him. He does not know how long his creditors will wait, and he has no way of predicting when he will have any extra income to pay back what he has borrowed.

Javed wants to build another room in his house. One room gives little or no space to the seven people who share it. His disabled sons are getting older and, since they are mostly house-bound, work and school, they do not need space there. His sons spend most of their home-time in the veranda.

But one room will cost almost two-months of sal-

ary for the household. There is no institution that will give Javed this kind of money. He cannot borrow from his employer or friends. But, even if he borrows, he would not be able to pay it back, so how does he even ask anyone?

His eldest child is a motorcycle mechanic. He worked as an apprentice in a workshop for five years and is now quite trained. Ideally, he would like to open up his own workshop and become an entrepreneur rather than continue to work as an employee. But he does not have any capital with which to start his business. He has tried his luck with a number of government programmes and microfinance banks, but there has been no break-through so far. Part of the problem is his poor educational background.

Javed's eldest daughter works in a beauty salon. She also feels that she could open up a small salon in their locality. But the issue is the same: she has no capital with which to pay the advance for rent and to buy even the minimum amount of equipment that she will need.

Rising inflation, increasing fuel prices, increasing prices of electricity and gas have significantly increased the cost of living. He no longer knows if the Rs40,000 that the family earns is enough to cover even the basics anymore, or what will come next. He has been in his current job for a year and his employer is quite satisfied with him, but there is no job security. The employer could fire him tomorrow if he wanted to. And finding a new job takes time. The last time Javed moved, it took him four months to find a new job.

Javed has never received any help from the state, nor does he expect any. He did not qualify for help from the Benazir Income Support Programme and does not think he is actually poor enough to qualify for that category of beneficiaries. But he also does not see how he can improve his

situation without help either.

He needs access to decent healthcare. This is the biggest source of his wife's and his major source of stress and shocks for him. His father needs regular medical attention. Javed and his wife have also earned Rs. His high blood pressure is starting to bother him now. His wife has serious arthritis issues. Having health coverage could reduce uncertainties for him and his family substantially.


Access to subsidised loans or grants, for allowing his son and daughter to start small businesses could open up avenues for major changes in the life of this family. These loans would have to be carefully crafted to meet the needs of the most marginalised and might even have to be individualised substantially, but they could result in potentially large gains for the family.

The younger children need access-to-quality education. If they are going to stay in schools, they need an education that will engage and challenge them. They have seen their older siblings stay in school for seven or eight years and not even acquire basic numeracy, literacy, reading, writing and thinking skills. They feel that if they are going to receive the same treatment as their older siblings, it would be better off being at home and/or learning a skill. Can the state provide decent school education that this family can afford?

The government's stated aims include the provision of social protection for the poor and equal opportunities for all. The Ehsaas programme was launched with a lot of fanfare as well. The success of the government will be judged on the basis of real change for Javed's family. ■

It takes two to tangle

SIGNALS are that the powers within the house of Sharif are finding it a wee bit rough to reconcile with each other's authority. The latest proof of a lack of, or a need for, adjustment came in the shape of a statement by Ms Maryam Nawaz that was found by the rightly inclined to be agitating against the considered view of her uncle, Mian Shahbaz Sharif.

Ms Nawaz had dubbed any possible 'merger-plan' or 'charter of economy', 'messy-i-mashay' or a joke with the economy. This preceded the channels with an opportunity, and they had a field day identifying the breach inside the Sharif fortress — not for the first, nor likely the last, time. The expected twist to this little rift that cast a long shadow over the Sharif dynasty's internal discipline was given by Ms Nawaz who, as predicted, furnished a fresh assessment of her belief in the leadership of Mr Shahbaz Sharif.

The point here is, it is not unusual for anyone to believe that two leaderships diametrically opposed in each other over not just strategy but 'vibhi' ideology as well can coexist in a party. Quite often, mistakenly, the Sharif-Maryam situation is compared to the old and successful formula where Mr Shahbaz Sharif and Mian Nawaz Sharif were supposed to be individually, and separately, providing leadership to the PML-N.

The sequence where a remark is passed by one of the authorities within the PML-N and then withdrawn on one pretext or the other has been played just too many times. The strain, or the causes that could lead to one, are increasingly stacking up. The attempt is to draw a parallel between that long-standing arrangement and the current understanding has been flouted from the beginning since over all these years of spectacular PML-N victories and occasional setbacks, it was never in any doubt as to who the supreme leader was.

Mr Nawaz Sharif is still that supreme adviser but his capacity to provide a bonding every required moment has been grossly compromised by his incarceration.

Everyday decisions pertaining to running party politics have to be taken by the relatively more free souls existing outside the walls of Kot Lakhpat jail. The process to reach these decisions is most definitely going to shake the minds of those who make them, given the different directions that Mr Shahbaz Sharif and Ms Maryam Nawaz took in evidence in this latest two-pronged, in fact two-faced, PML-N front.

Quite often, mistakenly, the Sharif-Maryam situation is compared to the old and successful formula where Mr Shahbaz Sharif and Mian Nawaz Sharif were supposed to be individually, and separately, providing leadership to the PML-N.

Over the decades, analysts, comprising both the one with ill intent and the well-wishers, have struggled to break down the ingredients of what went into the solid and lasting partnership between the Sharif brothers. One easy explanation we all indulged for years was that the presence of Mian Sharif, the Sharif dynasty founder, which had kept his sons united.

When the patriarch passed away during the Sharif exile after the 1999 coup, many expected Mian Nawaz Sharif and Mian Shahbaz Sharif to release each other's bondage. It was thought that soon they would embark on their independent journeys determined by the difference in their respective personalities. It's been some years since the alliance has survived the worst wishes that have been directed at it.

Looking for ever simpler explanations, the major, if not the clinching, reason for the contin-

ued partnership between these two politicians with distinct styles was said to be Mr Shahbaz Sharif's belief in the unshakable patriarchal system. It was said that he was able to easily replace his father with his elder brother as the leader, propped up on the basis of the respect that those with more recent origins must have for their elders.

In the most celebrated local tradition of jirai or chain of pairs, allegiances by the younger to the older statesmen is considered absolutely essential, and as recent trends go, the Nawaz-Shahbaz jirai is the most steadfast and the hardest to crack. Many other pairings seemingly unbreakable at one time, have fallen by the wayside; usually with allies were induced or deceived by interests around them.

Like items in a scheme, this allegiance business is complicated by other matters of convention like, for instance, the one in favour is always against the old forces holding the party together; many old things that are not being universally targeted do come under immense pressure to survive.

And a match between the ostensible and really desirable takes an altogether new meaning when the spotlight is put back on the PML-N in its present state.

Ms Maryam Nawaz is not to challenge — even if some old observers insist that what she has put up is a facade, and a longing for a deal with the establishment is not a fees pronounced in her camp in conjunction with other power-chasers in the country.

Her stance is going to repeatedly bring her in confrontation — before anyone else — with the much more softly moving Mr Shahbaz Sharif. And this despite the fact that for all practical purposes the Sharifian command of the PML-N was replaced with a Maryam takeover of the party some time ago.

A. Shahbaz Sharif having yielded so much autonomy in the party to his younger brother, it is a picture that is most difficult to imagine. Those will have to be rationalisation here. One plank will have to retire.

The other option is the takeover of the PML-N by one of the two factions after a clash that will be difficult to paper over with high-sounding, conventional lines. ■

Beauty of the Quran

ALLOWING our senses to open up to the majesty of the universe, we are struck with its beauty and grandeur.

The activity of humankind in pursuit of livelihoods during the day and its coexistence with other species, the silence and solitude at night, the dash of dawn that engulfs the world; theondrous scenes of birds with the change of seasons and the rustling of leaves as they swing in the wind; the rows of farms and the colour of fruit, cereal and vegetables that have been sown; the water bodies that provide the lifeline for all living beings; the hills and mountains peaks covered in snow in winter that melts and runs down as fresh water, are but a few signs of the inherent beauty of the world.

In the past, the Quran mentions seven skins, each with its own earth and the lowest sky has been graced with "lamps"; the sun, moon and stars. Each is set in its orbit and revolves within it according to a set of principles. While almost all surahs depict the beauty of God's creation, it is perhaps Surah Rahman that provides a magnificence picture of the favours of the Most Merciful.

According to a hadith, "God is beautiful and He loves beauty" (Al-Muwatta' Al-Anbiya', 5902). As per the contemporary scholar Khalid Abu El Fadl, what is a temporary sign of God's beauty shall perish, but His permanent beauty is eternal (Qur'an 55:26-27).

What can be a more beautiful manifestation of God's beauty than the book revealed to the Prophet (PBUH) to show the people of Makkah and all others the path to beauty, the path to God? In a circle in itself, it is beauty encapsulated in the highest of books, revealed to God's beloved Prophet.

The creation of humans is upon a basic nature or fitra: an instinctive, intuitive understanding of the differences between right and wrong and a desire for justice. When this is developed and man's arrogance and Satan's temptations are controlled, the human becomes higher and higher levels of beauty.

The Quran enlists us to do ibrah (the best in morality), command the ma'ayif (that which is right) and forbid the maa'ruuf (wrong deeds). In each of these commands, the Quran instils the spirit of beauty of our souls. It asks us to be on the side of justice and speak the truth, even if it goes against us and our families.

One of the most beautiful gifts of God to humans only is that of rationality and intellect. By using these qualities and honouring them constantly, we gradually become conscious of the beauty of the Quran. Strange

as it may sound in an era when intellectual reasoning is anathema to Muslims, this is what God has enjoined humans to exercise. "He has taught him speech (and intelligence)" (55:5).

Even for Muslims who do not understand Arabic, the rhythm of the words is a reminder of the naturalness of the language of the sea, or as springs meeting at a point and then expanding into a larger spring. There is a melody, even without the words, that strikes at the chords of the heart, immersing oneself in the verses brings a sense of peace and tranquillity, not to be found anywhere else.

As one begins to understand the structure of its morals, its coherence, its links to the story of the Prophet's life, the words are meaningful and refer only to those times, and how some are universal and need to be understood with reference to each other, one begins to decipher the meaning of the Sharia being the righteousness and beautification way. Every word of the book holds deeper meanings which are revealed to the discerning heart and mind, again and again.

How beautiful is the verse describing wives and husbands as garnishes for each other, having been created for love and companionship!

It is a single word, protection, confidence, care, and strength have been combined to preface the rason d'être for marriage. Yet, how many people would quote this, instead of insisting upon the juristic interpretation of husbands being managers of wives?

Islamic Jurists sought to interpret the verses of the Quran through existing communal and cultural practices. Once these laws were established, they seemed to be set in stone.

Muslims no longer shrink, seek the truth or deliberate upon the words of the Quran. Fadil suggests that in our rituals of worship, we often use the political, legal and cultural aspects of religion, while ignoring the ethical, the moral and, by extension, the beautiful.

Weighed down by our biases, arrogance, hatred, we forget mercy and compassion. We forgot our search for the beautiful; we forgot our search for God. ■

World Cup healing?

MUCH has been made of the meanness displayed between Pakistan's reigning Cricket World Cup campaign and the ultimately successful side captained by the current prime minister in 1992. Then too the team had a pretty dismal start and Pakistani fans had given up on their national team. However, one Indian Khan's famous overcooked tinger's mutton, some inspired performances, a healthy dose of good luck, and a few wins later Pakistan were world champions. We will know in a few days whether the current vintage will repeat the dose, but it is indicative of how far professional sport, cricket included, has evolved in the ensuing three decades that the team Pakistan must beat to have a chance of winning the tournament are Afghanistan and Bangladesh. That is something no one expected the team in 1992.

For most Pakistanis, it scarcely matters who we have to get past to keep the victory march alive. For me personally — and I dare say at least some others in this land of the poor — the fact that the World Cup schedule has thrown up most-win matches with Afghanistan and Bangladesh engenders a whole lot of giddiness of emotions that transcend just a desire for victory.

During the 1992 World Cup campaign, I was part of the Pakistan diaspora. I was discovering my anti-establishment self, but I had as yet not been exposed to revisionist narratives of Pahlavi's political economy and history. Today, I am a profoundly different being, unable to return to the ignorance of root-hood, and feel a deep connection with Afghans, Bangladeshis, Pakistanis and anyone else who has a commitment to speaking truth to power.

The Afghan team in 1992 is a Cricket Pakistan is itself a remarkable feat. Large parts of the country remain in the throes of violence, more than four decades of virtually uninterrupted war having decimated anitable culture. Pakistan is of course home to arguably the biggest Afghan refugee population in the world, the status of which continues to engender substantial controversy in the Pakistani polity. More significantly, the establishment and the educated, so-called "elite" depth in Afghanistan. Many believe that our strategic planners have now abandoned the brain-honed desire to simulate a sovereign country as a fifth province. When Pakistan plays Afghanistan in the World Cup, such thoughts and demands will be reminded that healing is the only way for societies to move on from the realpolitik of states. Those who call for truth and reconciliation are right to reject a never-ending spiral of hate and suspicion. It is another matter altogether whether the moral force being exerted by brave and principled voices of peace in both Afghanistan and Pakistan will compel those who wield power to truly move on.

And then there is Bangladesh. It is remarkable that almost 50 years after the fact, the majority of Pakistanis — who were of course born long after the secession of the eastern wing — are virtually clueless about the shared histories of Pakistan and Bangladesh, and particularly what drove Bengali nationalism. East Pakistan's contribution to the project of Pakistani nationhood.

This too is a story full of pain and suffering, and successive generations of Bangladeshis have certainly imbued their fair share of pain given that their country's official slogan is "Bengal Desh" (Bengal Desh) and its history of liberation. Yet ordinary Bangladeshis and Pakistanis can find much common cause, and at an individual level, many have done so.

But scaling up, the iteration of truth and reconciliation cannot be denied — our history books still repeat overtaking and there must be a serious reckoning with the exclusionary nature of official nationalism and Pakistan's political economy more generally (which causes of the conflict with its neighbour,孟加拉国). The Panchayati movement is involved in a increasingly acerbic battle about the legacy of national liberation and the attribution of responsibility on "collaborators".

In the days after the World Cup is over, we Pakistanis will not recall the games with Afghanistan and Bangladesh more than any other. We will celebrate a win, and lament a loss. One hopes that whatever happens, these two games kick-start a long process of healing that all players desperately need. ■

Unregistered orphanages

LAHORE: Almost all of the 36 orphanages which are not registered with the Social Welfare Department are in a deplorable condition and are being run on commercial basis. Prominent social workers, when contacted, expressed concern over the alarming state of affairs prevailing in these unregistered orphanages. — Agency

PESHAWAR: After completing their tour of the Frontier Province, members of the Committee of Action of the All-India Muslim League returned to Peshawar on June 27 and addressed their first public meeting there.

Nawabzada Liaqat Ali Khan said that in Pakistan alone they could live an honorable life. No power on earth, maintained the Nawabzada, could deny the Muslims their objective of Pakistan which must be achieved at any cost. He appealed to the Muslims to rally round the Muslim League.

This is because either the bankers are not properly equipped with the system or they do not issue any certificate or confirmation to the account holders in this regard after completing the process.

GMO tug of war

AFTROPOS the opinion piece "GMO tag of war" by Zubaida Mustafa (June 8). It is regrettable that the author has distorted and misinformed facts while propagating an oil-peddled anti-science propaganda.

The writer states that changes in the legal framework enabling the GM crop introduction was at the behest of "biotech giant". The fact is that Pakistan has had a long-standing policy of embracing and

promoting R and D of biotech crops since 1980s, prioritising any of the so-called biotech "giants" entering the market. In fact, many of the indigenous biotechnology research institutes and academic programmes have been in existence since 1982, conducting research on GM crops in agriculture, environment, food, pharmaceuticals and marine areas under.

The notion that GM maize is being introduced through relaxations in laws and rules is incorrect. The regulatory process for this technology is in line with the law (Seed Amendment Act 2015 and Biotech Rules 2005) fulfilling all legal requirements over the past 20 years.

The yield figures quoted by the author are incorrect. Our average yield is 1.9 MT/acre (1.3 MT/ha). While the high of 5 MT/ha can be achieved by larger farmers, smallhold farmers will only realize the potential through GM maize.

Philippines, US and Brazil are prominent success stories exhibiting yield increase of 72pc, 56pc and 102pc, respectively.

Contrary to the author's claim, there is consensus among the scientific community, locally and internationally, on GM crop safety. This was done through international scientific and field trials in Pakistan and across the world. Food safety authorities in the US, EU, Canada, Japan, Australia, South Korea, South Africa, amongst many others assess and approve GM crops for consumption as food and feed. The EU alone is the second largest importer of GM grains, importing 32 million tons annually.

The writer raises the much-politicised issue of glyphosate, referring to the accumulation of glyphosate as a "probable carcinogen by a WHO subsidiary programme". This programme has previously courted controversy for providing the same rating to red meat, night shift work and textile factory floor. The classification is inconsistent with 40 years of scientific research and is at odds with the findings of three other WHO safety assessment programmes.

Govt to collect additional taxes worth Rs516bn: Azhar

ISLAMABAD: Minister of State for Revenue Hammed Azhar on Thursday explained that tax to tax Rs1.5 trillion increase in tax target for the next fiscal year, the government has introduced additional taxes worth Rs16 billion.

The remaining amount will be collected through withdrawal of subsidies, rationalisation of exemptions and revival of taxes that were not collected due to different reasons in the past, he said while speaking in the National Assembly.

The government has set an ambitious revenue collection target of Rs1.5 trillion for the upcoming fiscal year.

He informed the assembly about the steps taken by the government to broaden its tax base including the integration of tax on around 55 million individuals with the Federal Board of

Revenue (FBR) database in the 10 months. He said the move will be achievable on National Tax Day.

Moreover, he said the federal rules were also implemented and the government has successfully secured data of around 152,000 offshore accounts under Organisation for Economic Cooperation Development (OECD) agreement.

He said the valuation rates for property were also rationalised to bring them in line with the market rates.

Shortcomings in the Customs Department were removed to overcome the problem of undervaluation and overvaluation.

He said under the free trade agreement, FBR was getting real-time data for exports from China — Pakistan's biggest trading partner.

Azhar said the government is also

moving away from collection of withholding taxes and had reduced duties and taxes on thousands of industrial inputs.

He added that in the budget for upcoming fiscal year, duties were either abolished or reduced to three per cent on 1,650 industrial inputs.

The minister pointed out that FBR had failed to achieve the desired results from reforms in 2013-13, however, this time around the revenue authority would again undertake a review of its policies with the help of \$400 million from the World Bank and benchmarks with tangible performance-based targets.

He said the accurate figure for internal and external borrowings in the year was Rs42.4tn. He said the government has also reduced the current account deficit by 30pc.

He added that the government had taken away powers from FBR to attach accounts and collect millions of rupees from taxpayers because it was also stripped of authority to raid houses and businesses without permission from their top offices.

Data integration of the FBR, implementation of banca rules, information on OECD offshore accounts and improved market valuation would help collect taxes, he added.

He said the sales tax on sugar was increased from Rs15 to Rs25 which would result in an increase of Rs3.5 per kg price of one sugar bag.

On ending the distinction between filer and non-filer on transactions of more than Rs5m for purchases of property, he said the government took the step to create a better environment for industries and businesses.

Azhar said the market exchange rate did not mean free as the government would keep a vigilant eye on market fundamentals and would not allow depletion of reserves below a certain level.

The minister said that many road projects would be undertaken in Sindh, Punjab including Indus Highway connecting Rajanpur and Dera Ghazi Khan and M. M. Ahmadi Road connecting eight districts from Multan and Bahawalpur to Lahore.

He explained that the government was reducing the education budget to reduce its development expenditure of Higher Education Commission by bliked by 35pc and Rs14bn were allocated for knowledge economy, data connectivity and information technology in research institutes and universities.

He pointed out that the previous

government gave a figure of Rs11bn on paper for health projects without consulting any feasibility as they had been funded by state-owned agencies for immunisation programme and federal health programme was increased from Rs10bn to Rs13bn.

He said that it was good that Sindh collected Rs100bn in taxes, while pointing out that it was relatively easy for Sindh to collect such numbers as it had port and headquarters of banks and insurance companies.

MARYAM NAIKHAN DAOSTI said that devolution of Pakistani rupee had shaken the confidence of business and markets.

Even after devaluation, the country's exports were slowing down and would adversely affect imports of machinery and prices of fertilisers and petroleum products, he added.—APP

'Trade tensions put energy transition at risk'

LONDON: Trade tensions risk throwing the global economy's transition to greener energy into disarray and could hurt energy companies' preparations towards it, BP Chairman Helge Lund said as leaders of the world's largest economies gather for talks in Japan.

Lund, in his first interview since taking office in January, said BP would rather see a rapid, orderly phasing out of fossil fuels than a delayed and disorganized transition.

The former chief executive of Norwegian oil group Equinor said BP, as well as rivals such as Royal Dutch Shell and ExxonMobil, would have a vital role to play to ensure a successful transition to low-carbon economies.

"It is better for us to see a path that goes rapidly," Lund said. "It will be very difficult for the oil and gas companies but that is a better and a preferred solution than an uncontrolled sudden change maybe 10, 15 years into the future."

London-based BP, like some of its peers, has taken steps towards meeting the 2015 Paris Climate Agreement to limit global warming, including setting targets to reduce carbon emissions from its operations, link them to incentives and ensure that investments are in line with the accord.

But many investors say BP still have to do more, including tackling emissions from the fuels and products it sells to millions of customers daily, known as Scope 3 emissions, to prevent a catastrophic rise in global temperatures.

Lund said however that such Scope 3 targets would be BP's handle to make future investments, whether in renewable energy or oil and gas. He nevertheless said the company's thinking around Scope 3 was likely to evolve over time.

BP invested around \$500 million in renewable power, electric vehicle charging points and other low-carbon technologies last year, a fraction of its annual spending of \$15 billion.

All the pressure on companies and governments to do more to curb greenhouse gases is rising as carbon emission levels show no sign of decreasing.

Investors managing more than \$34 trillion in assets, mostly from the developed world, have called for more demand-side action from governments on climate change, putting pressure on leaders of the world's 20 biggest economies meeting this week.

François Bayard said it will not accept a final G20 communiqué that does not mention the Paris climate change agreement.

"The long-term framework around the energy transition is important. Once this is much easier for big companies like BP if we have a stable global framework for trade and investments," Lund told Reuters at an BP's London headquarters.

Lund said an unprecedented level of cooperation was needed between companies and governments to bring greenhouse gas emissions to zero by the end of the century.

He urged governments to introduce a price on carbon emissions to allow phasing out fossil fuels, even though only a handful of such schemes have been introduced around the world.

Sound investment

BP faced a wave of protests by climate activists, including a blockade on its London office and protests at events the company sponsors.

Big investors, including Norway's sovereign wealth fund, are reviewing shareholdings in some oil and gas drillers, though not in BP and its largest rivals.

Lund, who took part in discussions on a climate resolution with a group of investors earlier this year, believes most investors understand that modern societies are almost built on hydrocarbons.

BP forecast that even with a rapid increase in wind, solar and other forms of renewable energy, fossil fuels will account for the majority of energy supply for decades to come.

Lund also warned that attempts to curb fossil fuel use fast could harm societies.

"It takes time to change energy systems ... If you try to build down the oil and gas industry quicker than you are able to build up a carbon neutral system you will pull societies back."

Lund said large oil companies would be vital for the transition due to their large balance sheets, technical expertise and scale. "To have a sustainable contributor for the long term we have to stay financially strong, we have to be a good investment,"—Reuters

Cotton market steady

MULTAN: Prices on the cotton market stayed stable on Thursday though plastic (used cotton) arrival remained slow consecutively for the second day. The Karachi Cotton Association also kept its spot rate on Rs4,800.

Plastic prices were recorded between the range of Rs3,500-4,100.

Cotton arrivals (used plastic) arrived remained limited as growers have halted the packing process due to low prices currently being offered. However, slow arrival has resulted in price stability.

According to experts, Senate Standing Committee on National Food Security and Research in April last had asked the government to set minimum support price for cotton to ensure that growers earn reasonable profit on their crop. However, so far the government has ignored the recommendation. The government should intervene to safeguard and protect the interests of cotton growers who are worried about the declining trend in the prices of cotton, they added.

According to sources, growers in Punjab are continuing to maize while those in Sindh are opting for sugar-sugar. This is an alarming situation and will cause losses to the country's economy, the sources added.

Meanwhile, the Punjab government has announced to constitute cotton survival committee which will comprise of cotton growers, cotton scientists, government officials and experts. The committee will derive both short- and long-term policies.

Palm oil drops

SINGAPORE: Malaysian palm oil futures slid for a sixth consecutive session on Thursday with prices trading near seven-month low, weighed down by slowing demand.

The benchmark third-month palm oil contract on the Bursa Malaysia Derivatives Exchange declined down 0.2 per cent, or 3 ringgit, to 1,963 ringgit (\$473.93) per tonne. "Demand is slowing down but we don't see a major downside from here," prices are still too locked in a range, said a Kuala Lumpur-based trader. "The focus is going forward is the Indian monsoon and excessive rains in the United States." Monsoon rains have covered most parts of cane, cotton, and soybean fields in western India and some parts of rice-growing areas in central and northern India, the country's weather office said. After a lumpy start, rains have covered nearly half of the country.—Bloomberg

Australian student feared detained in North Korea

SYDNEY: Australia said it was "urgently seeking clarification" on Thursday over the fate of a 23-year-old tourist and student feared detained in North Korea.

Alek Sigley—who speaks fluent Korean and is one of only a handful of Western students living in Pyongyang—is believed to have been detained sometime in the last three days.

In a statement, Sigley's family said there was no confirmation yet that he had been arrested. "The situation is that Alek has not been in digital contact with friends and family since Tuesday morning Australian time, which is unusual for him," the statement said.

Sigley, from Perth in Western Australia, had been studying Korean literature at Kim Il Sung University since 2015, while running a company specializing in tours of North Korea. He married a Japanese woman in a ceremony in Pyongyang last year.

Sigley has written various blog posts and articles about everyday life in Pyongyang—focusing on everything from the city's dining scene to North Korean app reviews and steering well clear of sensitive political issues.

Camberra said it was "urgently seekingclarification" on a man "who has been reported as being detained in North Korea." Australia has no diplo-

matic mission of its own in Pyongyang and is represented in North Korea by the French embassy.

The vast majority of foreign students in North Korea come from China, where education is significantly more expensive.

The son of an Anglo-Australian man and Chinese mother, he previously studied at Fudan University in Shanghai and in South Korea before moving to North Korea, according to his post.

"I'm enrolled in a master's degree in Korean literature in the university's post-graduate school. Because I am the only foreign student in this particular programme, my courses are one-on-one with the teacher," he wrote.

In contrast to popular perceptions about Pyongyang, Sigley described a life charring with Chinese exchange students, drinking with Russian students and playing video games and going to restaurants with students from Canada and Scotland.

He also wrote for the *Guardian* newspaper published in late March. Sigley said he had "surprisingly adventurous access" to Pyongyang as a long-term foreign resident.

"I'm free to wander around the city, without anyone accompanying me, interacting with locals can be limited at times, but I can shop and dine almost anywhere I want," he wrote.—AFP

More arrests as Germany widens probe of pro-migrant official's murder

BIELEFELD: German police have made two more arrests related to the assassination-style murder of a pro-migrant politician allegedly by a far-right assailant, federal prosecutors said on Thursday.

The killing of Michael Loeffelholz, who was shot in the head at his home in western Germany and raised fresh questions about the country's response to the rising threat from neo-Nazis.

In the latest arrests, a suspect identified only as Elmar J., 46, was detained for selling in 2016 the weapons—a 28-calibre handgun—allegedly used by murderer suspect Stephan Ernst, who has confessed to the crime.

The second man, Markus H., 43, is held on suspicion that he set up the contact between the gun-seller and Ernst.

The federal prosecutor's office said in a statement the two men, both Germans, were arrested on charges of "aiding and abetting" the谋害 before an investigation at the Federal Court of Justice.


"We assume that both of the arrested knew about the far-right views" of the murderer suspect, a spokesman for the prosecutor's office told reporters. "And we assume that they also thought it was possible and accepted that [Ernst] would use the weapons for a politically motivated killing at a later time."

But the spokesman said there was no indication that they knew Ernst, 45, was planning to murder Loeffelholz, who was head of the Kassel city administration.

Loeffelholz was an outspoken defender of Chancellor Angela Merkel's decision to welcome refugees and in 2015 drew the wrath of right-wing extremists by telling Germans who objected that they could leave the country.—AFP

Twin suicide attacks rock Tunisian capital

TUNIS: Double suicide attacks rocked Tunis's capital on Thursday, even as the country was plunged into uncertainty with the hospitalization of President Beji Caid Essebsi who was said to be "seriously ill".

The violence revived fears for the stability of the North African state, which is seen as a rare democratic success story of the Arab Spring uprisings but has been hit by repeated Islamic attacks.

Tunisia's Islamicists—one on a car to a security base and another against a security base—killed a police officer and wounded at least eight people, including several civilians, the interior ministry said.

Body parts were strewn on the road around a police car after the first attack, which took place on Habib Bourguiba, a central avenue near the parliament. The interior ministry said police had fled from the assault after that blast, while another policeman and three civilians were wounded.

"It was a suicide attack," interior ministry spokesman Sofiene Zouaghi said.

Half an hour later, the second attack targeted a base of the national

guard, judicial police and the anti-terror branch in the capital.

"An individual blew himself up outside the back door" of the base, wounding four security personnel, Zouaghi said, adding that both bombers were men.

Ambulances and emergency service vehicles quickly arrived on the scene as security forces tried to keep the curious away.

Body parts lay on the sidewalk near the police vehicle, which was targeted, and a policeman was found lying on the ground, just hours after news of the attacks broke, the presidency announced that Essebsi "was taken seriously ill and transferred to the military hospital in Tunis".

Key adviser Firas Gaidouchi described the 92-year-old leader as in "critical condition" and in a later tweet said that Essebsi was "stable", urging supporters to pray for his recovery.

Prime Minister Youssef Chahed said on Facebook he had paid a visit to the ailing president.

"I would like to reassure Tunisians that the president is recovering the necessary care," he said, warning against the dissemination of "false and cor-

rupting information".

Essebsi, the country's first democratically elected president, came to power in 2014, three years after the Arab Spring uprising toppled longtime dictator Zine El Abidine Ben Ali and sparked revolution in several Arab nations.

There was no immediate claim of responsibility for the attacks.

Upcoming elections

Sofiene Zouaghi, spokesman for the anti-terror prosecutors, said the suicide bombers wore explosive vests.

The twin attacks also came ahead of presidential and legislative elections, scheduled for October and November.

In April Essebsi said he did not plan to stand for re-election in order to make way for someone younger.

The interior ministry urged citizens to avoid the area around the Tunisian parliament, the residence of the president and other parts of central Tunis.

Tunisia, the cradle of the Arab Spring uprisings, has been hit by repeated Islamic attacks since the 2011 overthrow of Ben Ali.—AFP

Indonesian court upholds President Widodo's victory

JAKARTA: Indonesia's constitutional court on Thursday rejected a bid by opponent President Joko Widodo's reelection victory and dismissed his defeated challenger's claims of widespread voter fraud as groundless.

The court threw out the case lodged by ex-president Prabowo Subianto, saying he did not prove he lost the April vote because of widespread cheating and voter fraud—all allegations that sparked deadly rioting in the capital of the world's third-biggest democracy. "The plaintiff's case is legally groundless," said chief justice Amran Umar, "We reject [his] demand in its entirety."

The ruling paves the way for Widodo and vice-president-elect running mate Ma'ruf Amin to be inaugurated later this year.

"Thank you to the Constitutional Court which has settled the election dispute openly and transparently," the 59-year-old Widodo said in a televised address. "I'm calling on all Indonesians to come together to develop our nation."

In the course of a hearing that stretched over nine hours, the panel painstakingly described many of the allegations—including vote buying and that biased civil servants favored Widodo—as false.

The court, which assessed the quality of the evidence and credibility of witnesses, said voter-fraud claims were the responsibility of Indonesia's electoral supervisory agency and beyond its jurisdiction.

Subianto claimed the vote was plagued by "systematic, structured and massive" electoral fraud that cost him victory. His lawyers sought to overturn the official results that declared Widodo the winner with 55.5 per cent of votes, against Subianto's 44.5 per cent.

After the ruling, Subianto said he would consider his options. "This ruling is very disappointing for us and our supporters but as agreed we will comply with the decision and move forward," he said in a statement.

But Subianto, who lost a similar court battle in 2014 when Widodo defeated him, has little recourse, according to constitutional law expert Ruddy Harans. "If the claim is rejected then it's game over," he said before the ruling.

Some 47,000 police and army personnel were deployed around the court and other parts of central Jakarta amid fears of more unrest, but there were little signs of violent demonstration on Thursday.—AFP

Fresh protests hit Hong Kong

HONG KONG: Protesters

in Hong Kong blocked roads and forced workers to leave the justice secretary's offices on Friday to rock the city over an extradition bill that has now been suspended.

Millions have thronged the streets in the past three weeks to protest against the bill, which would allow criminal suspects to be sent to mainland China for trial in courts controlled by the Chinese Communist Party, in scrapped altogether.

"You know what everybody has deep in their hearts—is that this is about our future and it's very very personal," OIC, he said in the newspaper on Monday.

With attention shifting to the November 2020 election, few US lawmakers appeared willing this week to take on the latest allegation, with several Democratic senators saying they saw little impact. Some of Trump's fellow Republicans called such behavior unacceptable and said the legislation should be evaluated, while others accepted Trump's denial.—Reuters

US-led coalition killed 1,319 civilians in IS war

WASHINGTON: The US-led coalition said on Thursday it had unintentionally killed at least 1,319 civilians in strikes during its fight against the Islamic State in Iraq and Syria.

The figure is far lower than the death tolls given by groups that have monitored the conflict in the two countries.

"The coalition conducted 34,514 strikes between August 2014 and the end of May 2019," it said in a statement. During this period, it "unintentionally killed 1,319 civilians have been unintentionally killed by coalition strikes".

The coalition, which has repeatedly insisted it does all it can avoid civilian deaths, said it was still assessing 150 additional reports of civilian deaths.

Airwars, an NGO that monitors civilian casualties from air strikes worldwide, estimates more than 8,000 civilians have been killed in coalition strikes.

In a report released in late April, Amnesty International and Airwars found that coalition air and artillery strikes killed more than 1,600 civilians just in the four-month blitz to oust IS from the Syrian city of Raqa.

IS jihadists killed large swathes of Iraq and Syria in 2014, advancing "unchecked" in areas they controlled.

But the offensive with coalition backing stepped away at the "caliphate" until it was declared eliminated on March 23 of this year.

Ambushes and hit-and-run attacks have continued in both Iraq and Syria.

"The coalition will continue to work with partner forces to deny Daesh any physical space and influence in the region as well as deny Daesh the resources they need to resurgence," the coalition said, using an Arabic acronym for IS—AFP.

Huge crowd flocks to Istanbul mayor inauguration

ISTANBUL: A vast crowd gathered at Istanbul's town hall on Thursday to see the inauguration of new mayor Ekrem Imamoglu, whose landslide victory has boosted the opposition for the first time in years.

"Today is a celebration of democracy, a celebration of Istanbul," he told a sea of Turkish flags in the city's historical centre.

None of Turkey's main television channels, seen as close to the government of President Recep Tayyip Erdogan, broadcast the event.

It is the second time this year that Imamoglu, of the Republican People's Party (CHP), has handed the keys to the city.

His first election victory in March was annulled after controversial claims of rigging by Erdogan and the ruling AKP. But he won a decisive victory in the rerun last Sunday, increasing his margin of victory from just 13,000 to March to more than 800,000 against Erdogan's chosen candidate, Binali Yildirim.

The triumph finally taught a lesson to a handful of pro-Erdogan who failed to honour democracy, Imamoglu said.

The 49-year-old former district mayor has electrified the opposition by embracing the usual aggressive trade talk of Turkish politics.

Erdogan—who once said that winning Istanbul was like winning all of Turkey—appears to have accepted the victory. "We don't have the luxury of having a deal or...to the message given by our people," he told party members on Wednesday.

The defeat is seen as especially sensitive for the Turkish leader, who grew up in one of the working-class neighbourhoods he now leads as president of Istanbul mayor in the 1990s. It comes after Erdogan's bid of an economic slowdown and double-digit inflation which analysts say contributed to the ruling party's losses in major cities including Ankara in the March local elections.

However, the results showed Erdogan's party remained the most popular nationwide, with the president still credited for the economic focus of the early 2000s and for giving religious conservatives a seat at the table.

There have been divisions the government may try to court among religious conservatives.

The opposition CHP, which has reported this week that Ankara had removed municipalities' power to appoint the heads of energy companies, although this has not been confirmed, "underlined that it is a metropolis and has a vast budget. It is possible that Erdogan may try to block its funding opportunities. But... it has many opportunities to generate and develop its own funding," said Umut Cetinkaya, deputy head of the CHP—AFP.

Twitter announces action against politicians' rule-breaking tweets

WASHINGTON: Twitter said on Thursday it would label and "deprioritize" tweets from officials and politicians that violate its rules — more potentially affecting the prodigious output of US President Donald Trump.

The new policy enables Twitter to move against rule-breaking comments on the short messaging service while enabling messages and announcements that are important for public debate.

In these cases, users will see a notice above a comment which violates the rules and must then tap or click through to see the message.

Twitter also will "take steps to make sure the tweet is not algorithmically elevated on our service, to strike the right balance between enabling free expression, fostering accountability, and reducing the potential for abuse caused by these tweets", according to a statement from the Twitter safety team.

"In the past, we've allowed certain tweets that violated our rules to remain on Twitter because they were in the public's interest, but it wasn't clear where and how to make those determinations," the company said.

"To fix that, we're introducing a new notice that will provide additional

clarification on these situations, and sharing more on when and why we'll use it." Twitter said it expected these cases to be "rare" and that the new policy would only apply to verified political candidates and government officials with more than 100,000 followers. It will not affect tweets sent prior to the announcement.

Twitter has the ability to remove tweets and block users posting inappropriate or abusive comments, but has also started allowing users "serving the public conversation". To determine if a tweet violates the rules but must remain visible, Twitter will deploy "a cross-functional

team" from its safety, legal and public policy departments to determine "if the tweets are a matter of public interest".

Trump's claim of bias

The move comes a day after Trump doubled down on his criticism of Twitter, who has claimed the platform is biased and suppresses conservative voices, despite the president's following of 61 million followers.

"What they did to me on Twitter is incredible," Trump said on Wednesday. "I have millions and millions of followers, but I will tell you they make it very hard for people to join me

on Twitter, and they make it very hard for me to get out the message."

Even as Trump attacks online platforms, his critics have claimed that he violates the terms of service of Twitter by attacking the media, including judges, media, sports figures and others with whom he disagrees.

In one instance, he retweeted a video that appeared to encourage violence against a Muslim lawmaker, and on another occasion praised a congressional candidate for body-shaming a reporter.

Social media firms have been facing pressure to curb speech and extremist propaganda. Blocking accounts of many conspiracy theorists, but Trump and his allies contend that the purge also silenced conservative voices.

Twitter said this week, "Reddit said it "gutted" a popular forum of Trump supporters, claiming users repeatedly violated platform rules by promoting violence."

Facebook announced earlier this month it would soon open up nominations for a new 40-member oversight board to review its own decisions, saying it would be independent of governments and management of the social networking giant—AFP.

Mass arrests in Ethiopia after coup bid

ADDIS ABABA: Ethiopian security forces on Thursday rounded up scores of men in Addis Ababa and nearby Gondar in a sweep led by security forces across the country and the murder of the army chief in attack which have highlighted the political crisis in the nation.

The weekend attacks have helped pressure on Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed, already facing waves of ethnic violence which have displaced over two million people, as he pushes forward with democratic and economic reforms.

An ethnic-nationalist party in Addis Ababa, one of several political groupings gaining ground as political space opens up, said more than 56 of its members and supporters had been arrested.

"Addis Ababa alone, 56 of our members and sympathizers have been arrested while dozens other NAMA [National Amhara Movement] sympathizers in Oromia and Tigray have also been arrested," a party spokesman said.

The National Amhara Movement was formed around a year ago as a hardline ethnic-nationalist challenger to the Amhara Democratic Party (ADP) — one of the four alliance members in the national ruling

party, the EPRDF.

"It is posing territorial claims on neighboring regions. It is trying to re-establish the 'partition' of Amhara. Hence outside Amhara state," the International Social Media (Pakistan) 0345-6738217.

The security chief, Asamnew Tegegn, who is accused of orchestrating the two attacks at the weekend, was seen as being appointed to his post in the ADP's appeal to the more hardline residents of the region.

In Gondar, police arrested almost a decade ago in prison over a 2009 coup plot, he expressed similar views to the NAMA, observers say, and was likely facing dismissal over his fiery rhetoric and efforts to form militia.

Citizens harassed

Meanwhile, details emerged Thursday of a bloody attack in neighboring Benishangul-Gumz state as the hands of what local officials believe are now trained by Asamnew.

Abera Rayya, head of Benishangul-Gumz regional state police and security forces, said that around 100 heavily-armed men had attacked a village at dawn on Monday, "killing more

than 50 civilians most of them women and children." AFP could not independently verify this claim.

Abeyu, the perpetrator of Monday's attack managed to escape, but 15 of others believed to be planning a similar assault were arrested on Thursday.

"He believe the Monday attackers and the 85 armed men we apprehended were both trained by Asamnew Tegegn, with the aim to eventually attack neighboring communities," he said.

The violence is seen as a backlash to Erdogan's efforts to lead democratic reforms in Africa's second-most populous nation.

Observers say the prime minister's crackdown forces have severely weakened the unity of the once all-powerful EPRDF.

His knowing of the rains in the long-autoritarian state has stirred up protests demanding reforms in Ethiopia's nine autonomous regions, which are divided along ethnic lines, and fuelled jockeying for power ahead of 2020 elections.

Internet services were partially restored across Ethiopia on Thursday after a near-total blockade for the past five days—AFP.

535 'headphone walkers' killed by Dhaka trains

DHAKA: A total of 535 people have been killed since 2010 after being hit by trains while wearing headphones on tracks in and around the Bangladeshi capital Dhaka, police said on Thursday.

The mostly unlined railways of the South Asian country of 165 million people are notoriously dangerous, with around 1,000 fatal accidents or suicides every year.

But police said in recent years "headphone walkers" have become a new menace as people walk on tracks listening to music or talking on mobile phones using earphones.

"Walking on railway tracks and putting on headphones is banned in the country. Still a lot of people ignore the ban and are killed by trains," said Dhaka rail police chief Yesan Faroque Mozumder.

Fatalities hit a record high in 2014 when 109 people died.

Numbers have declined since thanks to an awareness campaign, but police said 54 people were still killed in this way last year.

Moshid Alien, the deputy railway police chief, said they have held awareness rallies and processions, distributing leaflets and warning people with loudspeakers.

"But people still walk on the tracks as if they were unaware of total consequences," he said. "Stun devices also live on land next to railway tracks in shackles made of tarpaulin and bamboo. Alien said it is "impossible" to secure the tracks unless people cooperate with them.—AFP

Russia releases first whales held in 'jail'

MOSCOW: A number of whales and orcas captured to perform in aquariums and held in cramped pens have been released into the wild, but experts warned the mammals may not survive after being held in captivity for months.

The release of six belugas and two killer whales into the Sea of Okhotsk in Russia's far east came after a huge international outcry over the holding in captivity of nearly 100 of the marine mammals.

However, scientists and activists criticised the move, saying it was not transparent and did not follow a previously agreed roadmap. They also warned the orcas may not survive in the wild.

"The release took place in favourable weather conditions," said the All-Russian Fisheries and Oceanography Institute (VNIRO), which led the operation. The marine mammals were in a good shape, it said in a statement.

Russia is the only country capturing wild orcas and belugas and selling them to aquariums, a controversial practice that has continued despite legal loopholes.

The controversy comes to a head when images of what the media have nicknamed the "whale jail" were published this year.—AFP

Pakistan take identical path to strike parallel with 1992 campaign

BIRMINGHAM: Twenty-seven years and a generation apart, Pakistan's World Cup team bears striking similarities with their 1992 campaign — when they started slowly but ended up lifting the trophy in Melbourne.

An identical sequence of wins and losses, and other eerie parallels, have struck a chord with millions of fans who believe that Pakistan could be set to come out on top once again.

In both World Cups, Pakistan started with a one-sided defeat to the West Indies, before recovering to win their second game — against Zimbabwe in 1992, and England this time around.

At both tournaments, their third game was raised off and they then went on to lose their next two games and win the following two.

Not only that, but the final win in both occasions was against New Zealand, who were beaten in both 1992 and 2019 until they can into Pakistan.

"It was same, the same sequence of results, points and then we wanted Australia to beat the West Indies for us to qualify," said legendary fast bowler Waqar Akram, who played for Pakistan in 1992.

"Then also we beat New Zealand — who was unbeaten then too. A lot of similarities, I hope the end result is also similar now and we win the World Cup," said Wasim, now a TV commentator.

In another similarity, Wasim was the leading wicket-taker in 1992 with 25 and another Pakistan left-arm pacer, Mohammad Amir, is second on the bowler's chart with 16 so far.

"I am not sure if players are following all these (differences) but this should motivate them," said Wasim.

But Pakistan skipper Sarfraz Ahmed played down any parallels with 1992.

"That's history but after we won against New Zealand someone told me that even in 1992 we chased down New Zealand's target with five balls to spare," said Sarfraz, whose team reached their 234-run target in 49.3 overs on Wednesday.

Fans are now hoping that the similarities don't end there, and even that they continue beyond the World Cup.

"Inzamam Khan was Pakistan captain in 1992 World Cup and 25 years after that triumph he became country's prime minister, so Sarfraz should also join politics and become prime minister in 2045," said one comment on social media.


Leading the tributes to their winning tournament was Inzamam Khan. "Congratulations to our cricket team for a great comeback. Congratulations especially go to Babar, Haris and Shaheen for their brilliant performances," Inzamam tweeted.

Pakistan, currently sixth in the points table with wins against Bangladesh and Afghanistan to play, still have an uphill struggle to make the last four.

The spooky parallels have already spawned messages memes on social media, with some of their long-suffering fans beginning to believe the start-ups might continue with the same scenario their record World Cup title meant.

Leading a side still unsure of a place in the semi-finals, Sarfraz is naturally not getting too ahead of himself.

"We are not thinking about 2023, we are going match by match," the wicket-keeper said.

'92 World Cup parallels are freaky'

LONDON: Former captain Waqar Younis says it is becoming "impossible to ignore" the parallels between Pakistan's World Cup resurgence and their 1992 triumph.

Victories against South Africa and New Zealand in the past week have breathed new life into Pakistan and Wales after they won semi-finals of the current five-nation tournament.

Their trajectory through the tournament has so far mirrored that of their only World Cup triumph to date, when they started slowly in 1992 before picking up pace to lift the trophy.

"It is becoming impossible to ignore the parallels with 1992," said Waqar in a column for the ICC. "The parallels are freaky and even though the players won't have been thinking about it, the way they are now is no way they can put it into words."

Pakistan's chances of reaching the last four have been helped by England's defeats to Sri Lanka and Australia.

The hosts now need to win both their remaining games against India and New Zealand to hold off Pakistan, should Sarfraz Ahmed's men beat Afghanistan and Bangladesh in their final two matches.

"It's moving in the direction that they might have hoped, if so, that would be something very special if they could win the World Cup," said Waqar.

The prolific fast bowler was robbed of a hat-trick in the tournament 22 years ago due to a back injury.

But he is hoping for a repeat of the sense of joy witnessed when the team returned victorious to Pakistan, for a nation that had seen little international cricket since Sri Lanka's team box was awarded in 2009.

"It will be particularly special, especially when we win," said Waqar of missing the 1992 World Cup. "I was over the moon though and I still remember every second when the team came back from Australia. It was wonderful. I'm hoping and praying that something similar happens again."—AFP

Bring on the boo-boys, says Warner

LONDON: David Warner says he's living the dream playing for Australia at the World Cup and no amount of boos from England fans eager to remind him of his one-year ban for ball tampering is going to spoil his mood.

The left-handed batsman shared an opening stand of 122 with his captain Aaron Finch as the defending champions beat India and pre-tournament favourites England at Lord's on Tuesday to book a place in the semi-finals.

It was Warner's seventh match for Australia after returning from the ban for his part in the Newlands Test scandal and his innings of 53 runs took his tournament tally to 500 at an average of 82.33.

There were boos for Warner and his former team-mates when they took the field but the 32-year-old from the tough south-eastern Sydney suburbs was not letting it bother him.

"At the end of the day people have the right to come in here, they pay their dollars and if they want to boo us, they can," Warner told reporters at Lord's. "As I said before, I thrive on that stuff, I love it. I went out to the corner there... and copped it."

"At the end of the day you have to smile and say you're going to come and watch us and we are grateful for those to come and sit down and watch us."

"I always just smile. I take my glasses off and look everyone in the eye and just smile."

"That is what it's about, I am living the dream. I am out here at Lord's, playing cricket for my country."

Warner said 12 months out of international cricket and returning to his Ramakrikken era had helped him adjust a change in his lifestyle and his spirit.

"For me it is about enjoying the game," he said. "When it is taken away from you, you realize what it is all about. Going back to grassroots was fantastic."

"I really saw smiles on people's faces to be out there on a Saturday afternoon, all the volunteers that come down and put time and effort in, whether it is making the drinks, making the lunches."

Mayor presents Rs26.438bn surplus budget for 2019-20

KMC proposes an allocation of Rs9.47bn for various development schemes

KARACHI: City Mayor Wasim Akhtar presented on Thursday a Rs26.438 billion surplus budget of the municipal administration for the financial year 2019-20 in a meeting of the Council of Karachi Metropolitan Corporation.

The budget outlay is Rs26,449 million, with the expenditures estimated at Rs26,438m, targeting a Rs26,937m surplus. The KMC has proposed an allocation of Rs9.47bn for various development schemes.

The budget meeting would commence on Friday (today) at 2.30pm after which the council will give its approval to the next budget of the KMC.

Total receipts in the budget for 2019-20 are Rs26,849.825m, including Rs20,324.087m as current receipts and Rs1,754.428m as capital receipts. Funds for the provincial annual development programme (ADP) and district ADP will be Rs4,341.322m.

The total expenditure for the next fiscal year will be Rs26,438.000m, of which Rs14,462.320m is allocated for the establishment; Rs2,280.905m for contingent expenses and Rs222.040m for repair and maintenance. Besides, Rs4,132.305m has been earmarked for development projects and works, while expenditures from the provincial ADP and district ADP will be Rs4,341.322m. Grants from the government are estimated at Rs12,938.837m and the provincial ADP and district ADP are Rs4,341.322m.

Expenditure from land and other departments is estimated as Rs1,591.425m and from MUCT it is Rs1,152.50m, whereas dues of the KMC against K-Electric are Rs4,409.94m.

The KMC allocated Rs3,334m for 700 development projects in the next fiscal year, of which Rs1,697.7m is allocated for 494 infrastructure (roads) projects and for 50 municipal service projects Rs2,255m, for seven transport and communication works Rs135m, for 62 health projects Rs270.1m, for 103 projects of culture and tourism Rs403.5m, for eight information technology projects Rs45.05m and for new schools Rs43.5m is allocated in the budget for 2019-20.

Giving details of the budget, the mayor said the KMC budget was reduced due to curtailment of Rs6.67bn by the provincial government which was made despite an increase of Rs22m in the NFC Award.

"The Sindh government had included the devolved budget despite [the fact] it collected less than 10 percent of the NFC Award. The Sindh government has been curtailed on sharing the revenue from power in the city," he said and added that it was hard to prepare the budget due to financial constraints and limited resources

as even staff salaries were difficult to pay. The mayor said that in the current financial year 134 projects were completed and 134 could not be completed due to the non-release of the fourth quarter of the annual development programme.

"In the current year the Sindh government allocated Rs16m for the ADP, but it reduced it to Rs1.5m in the KMC budget."

He said that the municipal administration had included 494 schemes in the last budget but only 481 of them could be finished immediately.

He also gave details of various development projects which have been carried out during the current financial year in the city.

Deputy Mayor Syed Arshad Haider and Metropolitan Commissioner Dr Syed Saifur-Rehman were also present on the occasion.

Sindh Assembly passes tax-laden finance bill

The opposition leader demands concessions in taxes for Karachi

KARACHI: The Sindh Finance Bill for the next fiscal was passed on Thursday by a majority in the Sindh Assembly as the Pakistan

Tehreek-e-Insaf opposed it vociferously. Their colleagues in the Muttahida Qaumi Movement-Pakistan proposed amendments to the bill, but they were rejected by the house.

The finance bill followed the Rs1.237bn Sindh budget which was approved by the house a day earlier.

Chief Minister Murad Ali Shah stuck to his stance that the tax regime introduced or changed by his government was the least as

compared to the ones implemented in other provinces. He said most such taxes would not affect the common people.

He accused the federal government of not transferring to Sindh its share, leaving the provincial government to levy taxes on certain sectors. In fact, he said, the cities would not be taxed more than what they paid last year.

Dispelling the impression that the new tax regime had heavily affected the cities as created by certain speeches made by the opposition benches, Mr Shah said Karachi is a part of Sindh and would remain so and "there is no need to further explain it".

He said certain lawmakers in the opposition benches tried to create the impression that differences existed between Sindh. He expressed his dissatisfaction over the "aggressive" attitude of the opposition benches. He said the provincial government had

Ride-hailing service driver shot dead

KARACHI: A driver of a ride-hailing service was shot dead at Sohrab Goth early on Thursday morning, officials said.

They added that Syed Shafeel Hussain, 26, was shot at and wounded by unknown gunmen within the remit of the Sindh police. He drove his car to reach hospital but died on his way in the Federal B Industrial Area police limits.

FBI Industrial Area SHO Qamar Javed said the man was driving the vehicle when gunmen attacked him somewhere in the area. He sustained a single bullet wound on the neck. He accelerated the car despite being wounded, but probably fell unconscious after hitting a ramp of the Sohrab Goth bridge.

People sitting at a nearby restaurant rushed to the spot and called an ambulance to take him to the Abbasi Shaheed Hospital but he died before reaching the hospital.

Mr Javed, quoting area people, said that they did not see any gunman nor heard any gunshot at the place. He said he believed that the man was attacked within the limits of the Sindh police and died in his jurisdiction.

Mr SSP Irfan Bahadur, who visited the crime scene, said the victim was believed to be a driver of the Uber ride-hailing service. The officer said that so far it was a 'blind' murder case for the investigators as they did not have any clues to the identity and motive of the killer.

Woman commits suicide

A young woman, estranged from her husband a few months ago, committed suicide on Thursday evening in the Manghopir area, police said.

They added that Bisma Noman, 22, hanged herself inside her parents' home in Gulshan-e-Tauheed, Orangi Town.

Area SHO Irfan Asif said she had developed differences with her husband and shifted to her parents' around six months ago. Relatives had tried to reconcile the couple, but their efforts failed.

On Wednesday, she asked her mother to prepare some drinks. As the mother went into the kitchen, she took her dupatta and hanged herself from a ceiling fan.

She was taken to the Abbasi Shaheed Hospital by her parents, whose doctors confirmed her death. The police officer said that they received information from the hospital about the arrival of the woman's body. The police fulfilled legal formalities and handed over the body to the family.

The officer ruled out the possibility of any mischief behind the incident.

'Anti-drug unit' proposed

'Foreign policy towards India should be made by qualified individuals'

KARACHI: After the Uri attack in Indian-administered Kashmir, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that he would isolate Pakistan. Then India did not let the Saarc Summit take place. It is increasingly becoming an extremist society. Pakistan should have a foreign policy towards India that should be based on research made by qualified individuals, the kind of policy that should not despair to talk to India in a more sensible manner to bring it back to the dialogue table.

This was said by former dean, faculty of social sciences and meritorious professor at the department of international relations, University of Karachi Dr Moosa Ahmad in his lecture titled "What should Pakistan's India policy be?" at the Jinnah Medical and Dental College on Thursday evening.

Dr Ahmad said that one should learn from history and regard the current situation. Quaid-e-Azam, Mohammad Ali Jinnah, Syedna Patel, Nehru and Gandhi had ever thought that once the two states (India and Pakistan) came into being, ties between them would remain tense and

communication difficult — disputes such as those of Kashmir, Siachen still exist.

Highlighting the matters related to policy, Dr Ahmad said research indicates that the relationship between us has never been so bad.

Over the last 60 years since the 1970 elections in Pakistan, India has never been an issue in Pakistani elections, whereas in India, for the past 30 years, that's not the case — they have a threat perception. Rajiv Gandhi came up with a suggestion about Siachen which the Indian army vetoed. Pakistan offered to demilitarise the zone, but India did not accept that either. After the Uri attack, Modi said that India must isolate Pakistan and did not let the Saarc Summit happen. India has also been stranded about the resumption of the comprehensive dialogue.

Coming to the last part of his talk, Dr Ahmad said Pakistan has six options

vis-à-vis its policy for India. The first is to take input from those who have a command over foreign policy issues.

Second, we should establish India into two, one the scholar

and the other the security

and the Centre for South Asian Studies at Foreign University which are there, but there's still a gap, and that gap is filled by the security establishment.

Fifth, foreign policy must be the domain of the ministry of foreign affairs. Six, Pakistan can give India trade and transit facility, but only to get something concrete in return, such as an exemption

of the comprehensive dialogue.

ATC defers indictment in policemen's bus attack case

KARACHI: An anti-terrorism court (ATC) on Thursday deferred indictment of 32 detained accused persons in a case pertaining to an armed assault on a bus carrying policemen in Chakri Goth on Aug 19, 2011 in Korangi.

Charged with killing four people, including three policemen, and wounding 30 others in the deadly attack, 32 accused, including Raeesa aka Mama, M. Qasim, Atif Iqbal aka Laumba, Usair Javed Ali aka Quaidkhani, Raheel Lodhi, M. Imran, Iman Ali Haq, Asqaf Ahmed aka Taka, M. Imran aka Warsi, M. Afzal, Gul Mohammad aka Shehzad Kalra and M. Imran aka Lamba. On Thursday, the manne was filed for trial and the accused absolved from the Tikk judge of the anti-terrorism court concerned, who was currently on summer vacation.

The detained accused persons, including the alleged "baba" Raeesa aka Mama belonging to the then Muttahida Quami Movement (MQM), were produced from prison. However, the judge put off the trial and fixed the matter for hearing on the amended charge against them on July 6. The Rangers had moved an application pleading to frame amended charge in the present case, claiming that some more suspects had been arrested.

Earlier, in January the court directed 11 accused suspects in the present case. The case of five absconding suspects, including the former in-charge of MQM's Karachi Tamasi Committee, Hamza Nadeem, was adjourned and 30 others wounded in the bus attack carried out by a group of 25 to 20 gunmen riding motorcycles in Korangi.

The police charge-sheetsed around 11 detained accused while some of their accomplices were shown as absconders. Two accused, including Asif, were killed in retaliatory fire, it added.

The prosecution alleged that detained Mama, a former senior vice-chair of the MQM, was involved in the attack on the bus in order to cause a sense of terror and maintain his hold in Korangi. It claimed that the accused Raeesa Mama had continued to his involvement in the incident.

Study depicts threat posed by plastic pollution

KARACHI: Plastics are impacting our air, soil and water quality and polluting our food system. They are even pushing out aquatic and other life forms extinction and damaging ecosystems. The issue of plastics has become an everyday global concern as well as in every large city of Pakistan that a collaborative and proactive approach is needed to address it.

The study was commissioned by the WWF International and carried out by the University of New South Wales, Australia, on the impacts of microplastics on humans.

It's the first global analysis to combine data from over 50 studies on the ingestion of microplastics by people.

According to experts, their findings are an important step toward understanding the impact of plastic on human health. It also further confirms the need to address the plastic systems so that it does not pollute ecosystems in the first place.

According to the study, the largest source of plastic ingestion is drinking water with plastic found in water (groundwater, surface water, tap water and bottled water) all over the world.

Inhalation, it says, estimates represent a negligible proportion

of microplastics entering the human body but may vary heavily depending on the environment.

Plastic pollution is a major threat to wildlife not only through entanglement and habitat destruction but via autotoxicity and toxic effects. Plastic pollution also has damaging economic consequences, with the UN Environment Programme (UNEP) estimating its annual economic impact on the ocean economy at US\$8 billion," it says.

Of the consumers studied, the highest recorded plastic levels include shellfish, beer and salt. Leaking of plastic into our environment and food chain has been low so far with an inadequate global response by governments.

"The long-term effects of plastic ingestion on the human body are not yet well documented, but evidence has shown that beyond a certain amount of plastic intake, it can lead to solid inflammation of the respiratory tract. In marine animals, high concentrations of microplastics in their digestive and respiratory system can lead to early death."

"Research studies have demonstrated toxicity in vitro to lung cells, the liver, and brain cells. The types of cellular toxicity observed include oxidative stress and potential effects on human health," it says.

Sharing his concerns, Hamza Naqvi Khan, director general, WWF-P, emphasised the need to promote alternatives as well as to develop a comprehensive strategy to ensure zero plastic waste in Pakistan.

"Research shows that banning plastic products should be implemented in letter and spirit and community

awareness programmes can be helpful to discourage use of plastics in our daily lives," he said.

Pakistan could learn from the example of countries like Rwanda where such禁令 had been introduced, he added.

Muhammad Moazzam Khan, technical advisor on marine fisheries, WWF-P, said the current study depicted a realistic picture of how plastics were damaging the environment and harming human life.

Referring to a recent report, he said it found that more than 90 percent of microplastics in one gram of sand along the Clifton beach.

"This is alarming as microplastics consumed by marine animals find their way to humans through seafood," he said, suggesting the need for more research to assess the situation of plastics including microplastics in Pakistan.

Sharing his data, he said around 16,000 tonnes of plastic waste was generated in the city and only 8,000 tonnes was lifted by the civic agencies to the dumpsites.

However, the remaining 8,000 tonnes of garbage was unaccounted for which went into the sea or remained on land.

"The large quantity of garbage becomes part of the ecosystem and pollutes the urban environment," he said.

The present study, the WWF International says, should serve as a wake-up call to governments.

"Not only are plastics polluting our oceans and waterways and killing marine life — it's in all of us and we can't escape consuming plastics. Global action is urgent and essential to tackling this crisis," said Marco Lambertini representing WWF International.

Badin may face desertification if not supplied water, moot warns

BADIN: Speakers at a conference on water held on Thursday warned that the area would face severe drought if no urgent corrective measures to ensure fair distribution of water, major parts of Badin and other areas in lower Sindh would gradually turn into deserts.

Former irrigation secretary and head of Save Lake Action Committee Mir Mohammed Parhiar said at the meet that water problems started appearing after the political government began exerting pressure on irrigation department officials to provide water to their favourites through illegal outlets.

The political figures asked officials to divert flows of water even to desert areas against the design capacity of canals of Sorkar Barrage.

He said that all water problems originated in the area between Sukkur and Kotri Barrages from where water was being taken from river through big pumping stations. A pumping station with a capacity of lifting 400 cusecs was being built

near More-Dash bridge to directly take water from the river to irrigate lands occupied by influential persons of the area in flagrant violation of relevant laws, he said.

The officials could have spent the huge amount of Rs1 billion on the maintenance of the two canals instead of wasting it on the construction of blockages, he said.

Mr Parhiar said that as per laws of Indus River System Authority, tail-end areas of Badin, Thatta and Sindh and other areas ought to be supplied water in the last week of April for early cultivation of kharif crops including rice while the areas of Sorkar Barrage should be given water after the lower riparians had received their share in the beginning of May in accordance with decades-old practice.

He demanded that such amendments should be withdrawn, saying, instead of increasing motor vehicle tax, the government should improve its transport system.

He said Rs200m had been increased under the head of professional tax while another Rs100m would be collected through the increased tax on stamp duty.

He was not amused with the government's taxing of food courts, saying eating out did not fall in the bracket of entertainment, while Rs200m had been increased on entertainment tax.

Mr Hussain said these taxes would directly affect the common man, opposing five per cent increase in electricity services, tourism game tickets, insurance agents and water collection. He said Karachi would be affected by such taxes more than the rest.

PTI's Arsalan Taj spoke on tax on gas and petrol stations.

The opposition benches said the government had taxed mosques and other places of worship, and increased the tax on oil on properties owned by charities.

A lawmaker demanded that the chief minister make an apology to his attitude towards the opposition leader at which Local Government Minister Saeed Ghani reminded him of the day when opposition members' demeanour was also "objectionable".

After all amendments moved by the opposition were rejected by the house, the finance bill was passed with a majority of votes.

New body set up to probe charges against SU VC, SHC told

HYDERABAD: The Sindh High Court, Hyderabad branch, on Thursday disposed of a petition filed by Sindh University Vice Chancellor Prof Dr Fateh Mohammad Rasool in response to the VC's plea against his suspension.

The statement was made by Sindh Boards & Universities (SBU) secretary Mohammad Rasool in response to the VC's plea against his suspension.

The bench comprised Justice Nasrullah Akhtar and Justice Irfan Ali Shah.

The secretary submitted the statement through Additional Advocate General (AG) Allah Bacha Saeed along with the June 26 notification regarding the setting up of the committee.

Mr Rasool informed the court that, in fact, action was taken against petitioner on same charges after approval of chief minister/chancellor under rules of business of government and Universities Act 2006.

According to the notification, the planning and development board (PPD) chairperson, Nasheed Shah Darvaz, will head the probe committee.

Home secretary Abdur Rab Kazi and additional irrigation secretary Ghulam Ali Bhatti will be its other members. The members will complete its probe in one month and submit its report to the Sindh chief minister.

He said that as regards contention in para 4 of petition that VC whollyheartedly took steps to improve standard of university, it did not absolve the petitioner from his involvement in illegal acts. About petitioner's contention regarding the removal of AG by the Executive and Anti-Corruption Establishment (EACE), the secretary offered no comments as the general on the point was still justice.

He, however, said that the EACE acted on CM's direction and no executive action was initiated against him.

Mr Rasool contended that the petitioner was handling public finances and this made him liable to be treated as a public servant. He said that a show cause notice dated March 22 issued to him had been withdrawn. The new inquiry committee, he added, was being notified under Section 13(3) of the University of Sindh Act, 1972, and the Higher Education Commission Act, 2019 to initiate the process of investigation.

The SBU secretary said that this court had on June 10 suspended the operation of the May 30 and May 31 notifications and both of them had since been withdrawn. He said that action would be taken in accordance with law to avoid deviation from statutory provisions in the probe against the petitioner.

Petitioner's counsel, Advocate Radiq Kabwar, argued that it was a third attempt by respondents against his client. Justice Nasrullah Akhtar told him how could he [the counsel] present respondents from issuing a notice.

The counsel was told that if there was any legal defect in the notification, he could seek legal remedy.

The court disposed of the VC's petition after the statement and notification was filed.

- Win the spade king with the ace, lead a trump and, if South follows, win the ace. This might seem ridiculous, but it's the only way to assure the contract, since you are guaranteed to score at least 10 tricks whether the jack wins or loses!

Assume North wins the jack with the queen, cashes a spade and shifts to a diamond. You win with the ace, draw the one outstanding trump, lead a club to the queen and, let's say, lose to South's ace.

When South returns a diamond, you win with the king, lead a trump to dummy's six and discard your seven of diamonds on the king of clubs to secure

the contract. Note that if you fail to take the trump finesse at trick two and South has all three missing trumps, you go down one against proper defense, losing a trick in each suit.

2. Here also you can assure the contract against any lie of the cards. Win the diamond with the ace, lead a club to dummy's ace and return the three of hearts toward your jack! If South has the queen of hearts, he can do no better than take it and return a trump. Even if the trump finesse fails, you lose only three tricks — two hearts and a spade. If North has the queen of hearts, he will capture your jack but cannot stop you from making 10 tricks. A trump return would automatically give you the contract — if the spades are divided 2-1, and is also true even if they are divided 3-0. In the latter case, North could return a trump from the K-7-2 at trick four but could not safely do so again when you next played a heart to prevent the way for a heart runout in dummy.

Now let's suppose that, instead of following the suggested method of play, you led a low heart to the king at trick two. You might then go down if South had the ace of hearts and returned a trump, since you could eventually lose three hearts and a trump trick.

Police pick family of Farishta before their scheduled presser

Girl's parents wanted to brief media on their reservations about investigation into the abduction, murder case

ISLAMABAD: The family of the 10-year-old girl, abducted and murdered in the capital last month, was allegedly taken away by the capital police on Thursday to prevent them from holding a press conference.

Farishta went missing from outside her home in Aligarh on May 15. Four days later, her decomposed body was recovered from a drama village.

A man booked the National Press Club for a press conference on June 27 and the club administration invited mediapersons to cover the event.

The invitation by the press club said

the family of the girl along with their counsel would hold a news conference at 5pm about the abduction and murder case.

However, later the man called the press club and cancelled the news conference.

When contacted by Dawn, the man introduced himself as Nadeem Khan, a native of Multan Agency.

"I am on behalf of the girl's family. I had booked the press club for a news conference. The family and I have come from Multan Agency and we know each other."

He said the news conference was scheduled in the afternoon but officials of the capital police reached the house of the family and took away the deceased girl's parents and a brother to prevent them from speaking to the media.

"As far as I am concerned till the afternoon I cancelled the press conference," he said, adding that the family was still in police custody and their mobile phones were switched off.

Replying to a question, Mr Khan said

the family had reservations about the investigation of the abduction and murder case. The investigators told the family that there was no evidence found or available to establish the allegations against any suspect, he added.

Besides, reports of medical tests, including DNA, were negative, Mr Khan said, adding the recently arrested suspect had been tortured and judicial remand and bail in jail against him has not been submitted to court.

He said the family had doubts and reservations about the investigation. "They did not know who abducted and murdered Farishta. The police had claimed that the arrested man was the culprit."

Government officials had reached an agreement with the family when they held a press conference on June 27, promising strict action against police officials for delaying registration of the case when the girl went missing. So far a case has been registered against only two police officials but action is yet to be taken

against anyone, he added.

Despite repeated attempts, police spokesman Khalid Awan could not be contacted for his comments.

The inspector general of the police (IGP) was also not approachable.

Other officials in the police public relations office were also contacted but they refused to speak on record.

However, two senior police officers told Dawn: "If you want to talk to the girl's father, we can put him on the line."

They added: "Check and verify the relation and status of the man who booked the press club for a press conference and dig out his motive too."

An official at the Shahzad Town police said they had not picked the family while the CIA also expressed ignorance about the matter.

The investigators conducted a polygraph on the suspect and collected samples for his DNA test, an officer said.

He said the police had met the family to brief them about the progress on the investigation.

Japanese airline wants to start flights to Islamabad: envoy

RAWALPINDI: Japanese Ambassador Kunio Matsuda on Thursday said his country's airline wanted to start operations on the Tokyo-Bangkok-Islamabad route.

He stated this during a meeting with Minister for Aviation Ghulam Sarwar Khan, says a press release.

The ambassador said PIA had two weekly flights on Islamabad-Bangkok-Tokyo route, so Japan Airlines also wanted to start flights on the Tokyo-Bangkok-Islamabad route.

An air service agreement (ASA) between Pakistan and Japan was initiated on Oct 17, 1981, and signed on July 12, 1982.

The ASA stipulates single airline designation with PIA being the designated airline of Pakistan and Japan Airlines being the designated carrier of Japan.

The minister thanked the ambassador for Japan's help through Japan International Cooperation Agency (Jica) for Airport Security Force and Pakistan Meteorological Department.

The minister said ASF may be provided institutional-based technical training for the equipment. He also asked the ambassador for reducing the time span between planning stage for and executing the equipment's provision by Jica.

A specialised medium range weather forecast centre costing Rs2.5 billion has been established in Islamabad through the Japanese aid. Japan also helped in installation of weather surveillance radars at Karachi, Multan, Lahore and Sukkur.

The ambassador said Japan wanted to invest in the textile and vehicle industry. He said his country was also interested in Pakistan's skilled manpower in the fields of industry, construction, agriculture, fishing, food, beverages and aviation. — Staff Reporter

Three of a family burnt

RAWALPINDI: A mother and her two children were burnt critically in a gas leak fire in their house in Dheri Haasanabat on Thursday, police and rescue services said.

Fire erupted after Ms Rukhsana, 26, along with her two sons, Rehan, 5 and Sudar, 8, came to the kitchen and showed a match stick to the gas stove to prepare breakfast. An explosion occurred which was followed by fire.

The woman and her sons were badly injured after being trapped in the fire. The victims, who received 85 to 95pc burns were shifted to Pims where their condition was described to be critical.

Abdul Sajid Mahmood, who is leading the investigation, told Dawn that Mohammad Shabbir, a grocer, was living with his wife and sons in a rented basement of a house in Dheri Haasanabat.

The IO said preliminary investigation suggested that Ms Rukhsana had forgotten to switch off the stove properly when she left the kitchen Wednesday night. As a result gas continued to leak throughout the night. — Staff Reporter

“I did matriculation from Muslim High School Sadiqpur Rawalpindi and then did my intermediate, graduation and masters in English from Gordon College.


As far as poetry is concerned it is a field which poses a challenge to do poetry and everyone doesn’t get that everyone does,” he said.

AJK assembly passes Rs121.56 billion budget

House approves 32 demands for grant in absence of opposition members

MUZAFFARABAD: The Asadi Jammayat and Khawatir (AJK) Legislative Assembly on Thursday passed the budget for 2019-20, amounting to Rs121.56 billion, including Rs 90 billion for restoring expenditures and Rs 24.56 billion for developmental activities.

Finance Minister Dr Najeeb Naqash presented a total of 32 demands for grant which were unanimously approved by the treasury benches in the absence of the opposition.

Many of the 31 opposition lawmakers had opted to stay away from the budget session for one or the other reason and the few who were present also staged a walkout on a trivial issue of the time of presentation of demands for grant.

Official sources claimed that the opposition lawmakers avoided moving out motions after the government agreed to some of their demands

regarding allocation of development funds for their constituencies at their discretion.

The house also accorded approval to the revised budget for 2018-19 to the tune of Rs109.275 billion, including Rs 22.275 billion for developmental activities and Rs 60.9 billion for recurring expenditures.

Besides, demands for grant for the additional expenditure beyond the approved budget for the fiscal years 2015-16 to 2017-18 were also approved.

Earlier, speaking on the floor of the house, prime Minister Raja Farooq Haider said the opposition could have played a better role by giving its suggestions for the next year’s budget but it had violated the spirit of democracy.

Citing that no one had tried an honest and clean file, he asked Speaker Shah Ghulam Qadir to constitute, if the house wished so, an investigation team to probe his resources.

“Unlike other premiers, I am not claiming rent of my personal vehicle. I don’t have any personal vehicle and I am ready to be dragged on the streets from Muzaffarabad to Miranshah if corruption of a penny is proven against me,” he said, asking his critics to look into their own conduct.

He asserted that he did not believe in victimisation and earnestly wanted to make the committee

bility process more transparent.

“I believed in victimisation, many opposition leaders would either have landed in jail or would be seeking pre-arrest bail.”

Mr Haider said he was satisfied that most of the bills had been passed by mid-June before the 2018 elections in AJK had been held.

“We are striving to fulfil the remaining commitments and will be successful in it long before the end of our constitutional term,” he added.

Expressing gratitude to former premiers Nasim Sharif and Shahid Khanzada Abbasi for providing adequate resources to AJK, he said he also believed Imran Khan a high esteem as prime minister of Pakistan.

“But I have told him plainly that my leader Nasim Sharif and I cannot compromise on it,” he said.

He said he was grateful to PM Khan for giving clear directions for resolution of the problems caused by Nono Jetham and Mangla power projects.

He paid off dues to his team for increase in revenue receipts.

While in Pakistan, the revenue targets could not be met, here we generated more income than our target which speaks itself for the efficiency of my team,” he said.

Later, the chair prorogued the session sine die.

Man held on charge of defrauding Pims patient

ISLAMABAD: A man was arrested on the charge of defrauding a patient at the Pakistan Institute of Medical Sciences (PIMS), police said on Thursday.

The case was registered on the complaint of Waseem Naseer, 28, from Lahore. He alleged that the accused had turned out not an exact amount due to him, collected samples from patients for medical tests advised by doctors and charged more than the prescribed lab fee, the police said.

The complainant also alleged that these doctors also had shrewd in the fee he had collected from patients that was why they advised unnecessary tests. He said the suspect had given the samples tested from a private laboratory.

The complainant was an attendant of his cousin, admitted to Ward VI of the hospital, the FIR said.

On June 28, the police registered a case and collected samples for the medical tests advised by the doctors, but did not deliver the report despite collecting the laboratory fee, the FIR said, adding its respondent Naseer approached the laboratory where he came to know that these medical tests had already been done.

The cost of this test was Rs3,400 whereas the laboratory had charged him Rs4,000, the FIR said.

Earliest, the man facilitated him in conducting a medical test of his cousin for which the lab fee was Rs25,000 but he allegedly charged Rs20,000.

With the facilitator refusing to refund the complainant asked him why he had charged him more for the test, but he started giving lame excuses and later tried to escape, but other attendants caught him.

When contacted, Karachi Company SHO Hafizullah Rehman told Dawn that after registration of the case the police had arrested the suspect and produced him in court which sent him to jail on a judicial remand.

During interrogation, he told the police that some doctors were also involved in the practice, the SHO said, adding investigation was in progress to establish the facts.

People had rejected civil dictators on July 25: PTI leader

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf’s Information Secretary Usman Sarfraz Cheema on Thursday said July 25 will always be remembered for dawn of democracy in the political history of Pakistan.

“It is the day when people of Pakistan rejected the corrupt and incompetent civil dictators,” he said.

While commenting on joint opposition All Parties Conference he said if there was a shred of conscience left in opposition leaders, they should seek resignations from politics and the masses should protest and pull them down to bring back country’s democracy and the reign of collages.

“Instead of working out plans for the restoration of economy, the corrupt lot is whistling over the ongoing accountability,” said the PPI leader.

He said for opposition leaders, the only way out was to return the looted wealth or to present documented evidences of their unassisted wealth.

Mr Cheema said for the first time in country’s history, accountability was in full swing across the board without any discrimination and most bureaucrats and judiciary were facing the heat of accountability.

“There’s no room for ‘Mukh Mula’ and ‘Noora Kuchi’ in the country anymore,” he remarked. — Staff Reporter

‘Budget will have disastrous consequences for middle class’

ISLAMABAD: Experts at a roundtable said the federal budget 2019-20 and the government’s stabilisation policy will have disastrous consequences for Pakistan’s middle income class which is expected to face a 40pc compression in disposable income as taxes, inflation.

The roundtable, ‘Austerity budget: assessing the impact on development and pro-poor growth’ was held at French Institute.

Former member of the prime minister’s economic advisory council Sadiq Sherani said the rising current account deficit and an overvalued rupee had resulted in a debt trap.

He said overvaluation of the rupee over the last five years meant that Pakistan ran a huge current account deficit, the largest in all emerging markets.

He said the rupee has been falling because external financing gap was over \$2.3 billion in 2018.

“The only way out for Pakistan from the severe crisis exists at the moment is through pursuing stabilisation,” he added.

He said Pakistan’s exports were not only the lowest among all emerging markets at 8 per cent but also continued to shrink.

Dr Faizal Beri, academic and member of the Economic Advisory Council, said the government was underestimating the consequences of the budget 2019-20.

“Jobs are vanishing, inflation is hitting people very hard and salary rates are pushing people in debt,” he said adding. “There is absolutely no guarantee that three years of pursuing stabilisation policies will yield any benefits or lead to a growth path.”

He said Pakistan needed over seven per cent sustainable growth but they was no vision for growth.

Another member of the council, Dr Ijaz Nabi, said economy’s structural problems created inconsistent growth patterns, regular trends of regression after monetary stabilisation.

Dr Nabi recalled moments in Pakistan’s economic history when the rupee had crashed but the economy found other ways of bouncing back.

“But without addressing economic fundamentals such as gross systemic inefficiencies across institutions, there is little chance that governments will be able to break out of the stabilisation-bankruptcy-stabilisation rut that they find themselves in,” Dr Nabi said.

Former Board of Investment (BOI) chairman Hassan Shah observed that both the budget and broader economic policy send negative signals to investors and citizens alike, that Pakistan does not have a medium or long term strategy or vision.

Business interests dictate the drafting of budgets whose review process is fast and there is clear elite capture over budgetary approvals.

The speakers suggested that decision makers should consider the strategic opportunities available to Pakistan through CPEC and utilise the country’s human resource for growth.

Police to launch suspects e-profiling system in Attock

TAXILA: Police are going to launch e-profiling system in Attock district to maintain data of suspected elements and the project would be initiated from Mianwali city.

This was stated by District Police Officer Attock Syed Shahzad Nadeem Bokhari while talking to newsmen here on Thursday.

Mr Bokhari expressed the hope that the compilation of data would be completed in phase wise in all districts and towns of the district and it is expected that it would be operational in three months.

He said e-profiling is a step towards public friendly policing where suspected people database would be maintained by the police to keep an eye on them.

With the launch of the project people living in sensitive areas would get rid of routine door-to-door checking, combing operations and other checking. Responding to a question regarding local residents’ problems while visiting their respective houses situated around Sikh temples, Mr Bokhari said on the basis of Mianwali police, he said that police in coordination with other law enforcement agencies would issue permanent cards so that the residents would come and go their houses without any hassles.

Responding to a question about security measures regarding Sikh pilgrims visit to the city on July 1, the DPO said although the number of the visiting Indian Sikh pilgrims was a few hundred, over 1,000 policemen would be deployed for the safety and security of the pilgrims.

The DPO said a multi-layer security plan had been devised for the pilgrims to avoid any untoward situation during their three-day stay at the Gurdwara Panja Sahib.

He said wall-through gates would be installed at the entrance of the temple.

Meanwhile, District Police Officer Attock Syed Shahzad Nadeem Bokhari along with deputy commissioner Iftikharullah Khan held a meeting with the officials of Evacuee Trust Property Board (ETPB), local municipal administration (TMA) and the Attock Department to review the arrangements for upcoming visit of Indian Sikh pilgrims on July 1.

Small industrial outlets in residential areas pose threat to residents

Civil Defence Department survey shows over 4,000 illegal factories operating in thickly-populated areas, official says

RAWALPINDI: The mushroom growth of illegal factories in the residential areas is creating noise and air pollution besides endangering the life and health of the residents.

Establishment of small industrial units in the thickly-populated areas of the city is against the local government laws but the district administration and the civic agencies concerned remain oblivious of the issue.

Under the law, residential areas cannot be used for commercial activities.

Most of the factories are preparing polythene bags, plastic chappals and other products. During the process, smoke emanating from these illegal outlets creates air as well as noise pollution.

A senior official of the district environment department told Dawn that air and noise pollution had increased in the city and there was a need to stop such activities.

He said the waste generated from the factories was also being dumped in Leh Nullah without adopting safety measures which could pollute the ground water. He said for the establishment of a factory or other units, permission from the environmental department was required.

The Civil Defence Department conducted a survey in the city and found more than 4,000 illegal factories including Khayaban-e-Sir Syed, Bangash Colony, Dhoke Dhal, Bagh Sarداران, Mohanpara and Sadigabad.

These small-scale factories manufacture and prepare goods using chemicals and other inflammable material and any untoward situation could occur as they do not adopt any safety measures.

The report said shortage of facilities in these factories posed a risk of fire incidents as most of them have no fire fighting systems. Besides, these outlets were established in narrow streets.

According to the building by-laws, essential safety measures are basically required in commercial, industrial and public buildings to ensure the safety of occupants in the event of a fire or emergency.

Apart from this, godowns have also been established in residential areas especially around Moti Bazaar, Bala Market, Raja Bazaar, Urdu Bazaar and Monroe Road.

When contacted, Civil Defense Officer Talib Hussain admitted that there were more than 4,000 illegal small industrial units in different parts of the city and his department had so far issued notices to more than 300 outlets.

He said such illegal industries should be shifted outside the residential areas.

He said houses were being used for commercial purposes and in case of a fire people living in the vicinity of these units would suffer.

About the increasing trend of converting residential houses into godowns, he said it was illegal. He said the traders and shopkeepers often sell their goods and many fire incidents had occurred during the last few years.

When contacted, Rawalpindi Development Authority (RDA) Chairman Arif Zaidi said illegal factories should be removed from the residential areas.

He claimed that the RDA had removed all illegal factories set up in 13 housing colonies under the administrative control of the civic body before Ramzan. He said the RDA wanted to clear residential areas from illegal factories.

He said Rawalpindi Municipal Corporation (RMC) failed to remove illegal factories from its area and it created problems for the RDA. He said there was a need to close the city of such outlets immediately.

Man kills bridegroom's brother over marriage row

SAHIPAL: A man along with his five accomplices allegedly opened fire on wedding guests, killing younger brother of bridegroom and injuring others over rejection of his proposal on Thursday near Jamia Khan locality at village 111/9-A, sector 10, Lahore's Pakka Road.

Reports said main suspect Abd Ali wanted to marry daughter of Liaqat Ali who rejected his proposal. Liaqat arranged marriage of his daughter with Shabbir Khan, a resident of village 38/D.

According to eyewitnesses, on Thursday [when the wedding party [brutal] arrived at the residence of Liaqat, six men opened fire as a result two brothers of bridegroom - Asad Khan and Haseeb Khan - suffered injuries. Asad succumbed to his injuries on the spot while Haseeb was shifted to DHA Hospital. Some guests overpowered one of the suspects and handed him over to police. The suspect managed their escape.

Yousafwala police have registered a murder case on the complaint of bridegroom's elder brother Qadeer Khan.

DISPOSED OF: The regional ombudsman has disposed of a sexual harassment application and cleared the principal of Sahiwal Medical College (SMC) of allegations owing to lack of evidence.

Reports said a nursing college staff member was transferred because of her [alleged] misconduct and she [on Oct 22, 2018] accused the principal of sexually harassing her.

The ombudsman filed a petition before the principal's decision with the Multan bench of the Lahore high Court. The bench had turned down her application for lack of evidence.

All political parties have made blunders: speakers

ISLAMABAD: In a country where voices of visible segments of society go unheard, how that of the invisible could be heard. Moreover, all political parties in the country made blunders.

These views were expressed by most of the speakers at a 'Media for all' national conference on pluralism and diversity in Pakistani media on Thursday.

The event was jointly organised by Institute for Research, Advocacy and Development (IRADA), People's Commission on Minorities' Rights (PCMNR) and Sindh Commission on the Status of Women (SCSW).

Speaking on the occasion, former senator Faizullah Babar agreed that political parties made mistakes but he said it happened because of the overall failure of society.

"Unfortunately, we privatized jihad due to which intolerance in society increased."

Whatever happened with [late governor Punjab] Salmaan Taseer, the same happened with [former interior minister] Ahsan Iqbal, who was attacked over the issue of blasphemy. However, it was ignored that Mr Iqbal's mother had played a role in getting the death penalty included in the blasphemy law," he said.

"Parliament can make laws but cannot get it implemented. Similarly, Supreme Court can implement judgments even as the one regarding minority rights in 2014 but cannot get it implemented," he said.

Mr Babar said space for the civil society was shrinking. He suggested that voice should be raised against the visible and invisible censorship on the media.

He said the state played fraud with non-Muslims when former military dictator Ziaul Haq declared that we're free from the objectives enshrined in the Constitution regarding their right to profess their religion.

(HRCP) Secretary General Harris Khalique said Pakistan was British India's successor state.

MCI, CDA at odds over transfer of officers

Mayor refuses to enforce CDA posting orders

ISLAMABAD: Metropolitan Corporation Islamabad (MCI) and Capital Development Authority (CDA) officials are once again at loggerheads over the transfer and posting of officers made by the civic agency as the mayor has refused to implement the posting orders in the directorates under his control.

Meanwhile, Mayor Sheikh Amran Aziz, in a letter dated June 21 addressed to the CDA chairman, stated: "It was understood and decided that CDA would make no posting, transfer or give additional posts in the MCI functioning without prior approval of the chief metropolitan officer or the mayor."

However, it has been observed with great concern that recently the human resources department, CDA, issued posting/transfers orders of directors, deputy director, assistant director water supply and assistant director City coverage Division without any consent/approval of the mayor in violation of the law.

The letter said: "This is for your record and future guideline that any posting and transfers made by the CDA in MCI would be a violation of the provision of ICT Local Government Act 2015. Therefore, further postings/transfers shall be made without the explicit approval of MCI,"

said the letter.

When contacted, CDA spokesman Syed Sajid Ali said: "The civic authority under previous rules and regulations can post its employees. It is clarified that CDA staff or members are neither on deputation nor absorbed as yet. Therefore, one officer can be posted from one department to the other, keeping in view the city's interest."

Mr Ali further added that no reshuffle had been carried out in the MCI and only a director had been posted out from the corporation to the CDA and a replacement has been provided in his place. As a goodwill gesture, the CDA management had decided to consider any request from the MCI on merit and in accordance with rules.

Hamza's
'front man'
gets bail

LAHORE: The Lahore High Court on Thursday granted post-conviction bail to Mian Iftikhar Cheema, an alleged front man of Leader of the Opposition in Punjab Assembly Hamza Shahbaz and his brother Salman Shahbaz, in a money laundering case instituted by the National Accountability Bureau (NAB).

Reiterating the bail petition of Mr Cheema before a two-judge bench, Advocate Asad Manzoor Butt argued that his client had turned approver in the case against Hamza and Salman and recorded his confessional statement before the judicial magistrate concerned. Justice, trial court, rejected the petitioner to jail on judicial remand.

The counsel said NAB no more required the petitioner in the case and keeping him behind the bars would serve no purpose. Therefore, he asked the court to release the petitioner on bail.

A NAB prosecutor told the bench that the prosecution would have no objection if the petitioner was released on bail.

The bench comprising Justice Ali Baqar Naqvi and Justice Sardar Ahmad Nasim allowed the petition and directed the court to release Mr Cheema subject to two security bonds of Rs500,000 each.

Mr Cheema, in his confessional statement, had said that he had handed over Rs600 million for Mr Hamza and his brother. The appraiser said he had been working for the two brothers since they started looking after their family business of sugar and oil.

He said he was a wholesale dealer for Sarmam

Maryam raps govt for disallowing visitors to Nawaz in jail

LAHORE: Claiming that incarcerated Nawaz Sharif is suffering from recurring angina attacks, the ousted premier's daughter Maryam Nawaz says only a limited number of visitors are being allowed to meet her father in jail.

In a series of tweets about her father's physical and country's economic health on Thursday, she said that despite recurring angina, Nawaz Sharif's doctor was not being allowed access to him.

"Despite recurring angina, MNS's cardiologist is not being given access to him. Even today he was made to wait outside jail for 2

hours & sent back without meeting, Sharif on Jail-e-Azam."

On Thursday, the day allocated for visiting inmates at the Kot Lakhpati jail where Mr Sharif is serving his term in a corruption case, only five close relatives, including Maryam, were permitted to visit the ex-premier.

She pointed that even the few meetings she had with her father were also strictly monitored in violation of the basic human rights and hinted at street agitation on the issue.

"Today too only 5 members (including blood relatives) were allowed to meet MNS, that too under strict surveillance. This is violation of basic human rights. I am NOT

going to be a passive spectator. Beware."

She said this in response to a query on one of her Twitter followers in which he asked whether that Maryam should be given a visit outside the Kot Lakhpati jail until permission was allowed to visit him.

"Now seek a step action instead," Maryam added.

She said if the 'Sham' government didn't allow Mian Sabir to meet him and if God forbid the court to agree/agrees, then hundreds of millions of votes of the PML-N should know who is to be held responsible for it.

The PML-N vice-president sees the denial of medical facilities to

her father as political victimisation under direct supervision of Prime Minister Imran Khan after she turned vocal against the interim government.

"The victimisation increases as I become more vocal. Jails-e-Azam is directly monitoring this. Would have been better if he had focused his energies on the sinking economy instead of Sharif family. What a petty, spiteful man!"

Mr Nawaz shamed Imran Khan government for rapid slide of Rupee, sugar shortage and other negative economic indicators.

Four die in rain-related incidents

TOBA TEK SINGH: A farmer died when the wall of his house fell on him during heavy windstorm followed by rain on Wednesday night at Kamala.

The family was asleep in the house on Wednesday night when due to windstorm, the wall of the house collapsed on them. Villagers rescued them from the debris but Dalma, his wife Bhagwan Bibi and relative Adnan (eight) later died.

Minor girl Aliya was injured and shifted to the Okara District Headquarters Hospital.

In another incident in village 33/29/A on Okara-Faisalabad Road, a family of five people was buried under roof debris.

Villagers rescued Younis, his wife Sheema Bibi and three minor children who were later shifted to the hospital by Rescue 1122.

'Shahbaz govt signed expensive contract'

LAHORE: Health Minister Dr Yasmeen Rashid says the previous Punjab government signed a memorandum of understanding with the 'Medi Uro' company of 20 mobile health units and Rs2.5 million were monthly expenses of one mobile health unit, according to the contract.

LAHORE: A number of middlemen (commission agents/astaghars) of Pakpatan have alleged that the government's plan of shifting the grain market outside the city is also to benefit an MPA of the ruling party.

The plan is not to facilitate the middlemen, but to benefit the MPA, as a shop, which was earlier of Rafi million, is now R5 million," Rao Khalilullah, Pakpatan Ghali Mandi Association chief, told journalists here on Thursday.

Flanked by other office bearers — Ram Ishaq Ahmad, Abdul Haq, Ahmad Hasan Chisti, Rana Riaz, Tariq Bhatti and others, he said the Punjab government was under

immense pressure from local politicians. He said that since there was no issue at the existing market, why the government was in a hurry to execute the plan. "As 70 per cent of the middlemen are unable to purchase a Rs5 million shop, National Accountability Bureau and Anti-Corruption Establishment must take notice of the situation," he demanded.

The Pakpatan district administration dispelled the impression, stating that some commission agents have been creating hurdles in the way of new market for years.

"The plan was envisaged in 2007, as then government was of the view that grain, fruit / vegetable markets should be outside the city areas. They cause traffic congestion, environmental and

other issues. So the government acquired 25 acres for the grain market whereas the existing market is on seven acres," said Commissioner Ahmed Kamal Maan Dohar Dohar.

He said in 2010/11, the government paid compensation to the persons whose land was required under the law and action was taken on a massive littering stand on the site that continued till last year.

The middlemen raised two issues — parking and linking of the new market to main Sahiwal road. "Accepting their demands, the government planned to acquire seven acres more," he added.

He said the plan didn't benefit politicians from any part, as it only facilitates a huge population living in Pakpatan and its suburbs.

Probe finds IO guilty of helping robbery suspects in their escape

FAISALABAD: A departmental probe has found an assistant sub-inspector guilty of helping three robbery suspects in their escape from police custody.

According to the probe findings, these suspects — Atta, Amjad and Asim, all residents of Depalpur, Okara district, had been arrested by the Sialkot police in connection with two robbery cases (FIRs No 5009/SP and 601/SP).

Police claimed that during the interrogation the suspects confessed to have robbed the people in the remit of the Kharriawala police station on May 12 last.

On June 12, the investigation officer, ASI Abdul Razzaq, took physical remand of the suspects for further investigation and recovered Rs30,000 from them, besides two pistols.

On June 22, Razzaq produced the three suspects in a court and obtained their 14-day judicial remand.

However, instead of sending the suspects to the district jail, the ASI kept them in Kharriawala police lockup on transitory remand.

Next day, he told his seniors that when he was shifting the suspects to the district jail from Sialkot police lockup, they snatched his official weapon, handcuffs' key and his mobile phone from him and held him hostage near Chak 211-KR.

He claimed the suspects took him to Depalpur area, where they released him from custody.

However, the probe found that the ASI took the suspects from the lockup, left the police station without any police guard and used a private car to transport them, declaring Razzaq guilty of helping the suspects in their escape.

It also found front desk officer and moharrar negligent.

It also mentioned poor monitoring by officers who were unaware of the escape for 24 hours until the ASI himself informed them of the matter.

Punjab govt considers ban on plastic bags

LAHORE: While the Federal Capital Territory will ban all plastic bags from Aug 14 this year, the ban is also being seriously considered by the Punjab government, albeit in phases.

At a meeting on Thursday, Environment Protection Department Secretary Salman Iqbal spoke about the ban on the use of plastic bags. The meeting was held at the EPD.

EPD Director General Tauseef Jabbar, UET Professor Dr Yasir Gill, Polymer Laba PKCRI, Lahore, Dr Saima Taj, representatives from the BWP and the Plastic Bags Manufacturers Association attended the meeting.

Mr Iqbal said the use of plastic bags comes with a very high cost to the environment and negatively affects human health. Countries around the world have begun banning the use of plastic bags while some have enforced restricted laws against the use of plastic bags because of the negative effects of their usage.

"One of the main causes of pollution is the use of these plastic bags," he said and added that he was initiating three committees — legislative committee, technical committee and committee to look after the social and economic impacts of the use of plastic bags. These committees will give their recommendations in order to ban the use of plastic bags.

Meanwhile, two petitions have been filed in the Lahore High Court, one regarding a ban on plastic bags, while the other is still ongoing.

60 police personnel from Khyber get service cards

LANDIKOTAL: The Central Police Office of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa has issued service cards to at least 60 police personnel in Landikotal tribal district.

Growers oppose massive cut in tobacco duty

PESHAWAR: The growers have opposed massive cut in tobacco tax on tobacco insisting the government's move will encourage the black marketing of the cash crop and harm economy.

They demanded immediate withdrawal of the decision to prevent their "economic murder".

The government has announced the reverting of the Rs 200 per kg advanced Federal Excise Duty on tobacco imposed to check the illegal tobacco trade to Rs 100 per kg.

Addressing a news conference at the Peshawar Press Club on Thursday, local tobacco farmer Abdul Qayyum said that the reverting of tobacco tax on tobacco would promote the illicit tobacco trade and harm local tobacco growers.

Accompanied by farmers Ali Ahmad and Gulzar Khan, he criticised the government for yielding to tax evaders. He said the tobacco sector could earn huge revenue through the Rs 100 advance tax.

Abdul Qayyum said some growers claimed that the collection of advance tax on tobacco was exploitation and the demand for tobacco would decrease due to the imposition of the adjustable excise duty.

He said the Pakistan Tobacco Board Ordinance, 1968, protects tobacco growers and made it binding for tobacco manufacturing companies to purchase additional tobacco yield from growers.

All Ahmad said the farmers' associations were being used to pressure the government for withdrawing steps meant to curtail illegal trade to help the growth of tobacco crop.

He said growers were being exploited by the local illegal cigarette manufacturers since the levy not only forced them to pay to the adjustable tax on processed leaf but also provided the FRR with lead position data for all manufacturers.

"This tax is advance and assessable and is applicable to manufacturers and does not hurt farmers at all, whereas local and small farmers are the ones who benefit from it," insisted farmers of KP for own benefit," he said.

The grower said the commerce ministry had fixed the minimum indicative price of tobacco every year after proper consultation with the representatives of tobacco growers.

Another farmer, Gulzar Ahmad, said local companies avoided tobacco purchase in the open market just to evade tax and that they also preferred farmers by delaying payments and rejecting tobacco on the pretext of low-quality leaves.

He said the local companies met their demand by using funds raised for purchases and not providing loans, fertilisers and other facilities to farmers, while instead taxpaying companies supported growers. — Business Report

Protesting traders demand withdrawal of new taxes

PESHAWAR: The traders on Thursday set up a protest camp at Choruk Yatagan against the new taxes imposed in the provincial and federal budgets and urged the government to control price hike and stop raids for recovery of taxes otherwise they would announce shutdown strike for indefinite period.

The representatives of traders unions from different areas of Peshawar participated in the protest camp. The traders, wearing black armbands, also displayed black banners at prominent places to highlight their demands.

Speaking at a joint press conference, the trader leaders said that scores of new taxes were imposed in the new budgets without taking the business community into confidence. They said that they recorded their protest to press the government for resolution of the issues through peaceful negotiations.

Mansoor Tariq, Tariq's president Malik Mehdi Hashi, Tajir Iftah Peshawar chairman Khalid Ayub, Tariq-i-Peshawar president Mohammad Shoaibul Haider and other others said that they were not ready to pay any additional tax as they did not have financial resources to fulfil the government's demands.

They said that government was harassing traders through crackdown for collection of different taxes but it would not succeed to achieve its unrealistic targets through use of force. They said that all the segments of the society including vendors were taxed. They added that in the past the tax collection was up to Rs 100,000, which was徵收 to 400,000.

Meher Hashi said that government also imposed professional tax on traders, who had nothing to do with it. He said that the business community was already paying trade tax, which included different taxes. He said that most of the people did not know names of the additional taxes and the departments collecting the taxes.

Mr Hashi said that government was supposed to take traders on board and incorporate their suggestions in the budget documents to collect the taxes and provide services to the traders. He demanded that the rates should be fixed by officials of customs department on different shops and godowns in Sudder Bazaar and described the action as attempt to create unrest among the business community.

On the occasion, the traders through a unanimously adopted resolution demanded of the government to resolve their issues through talks otherwise they would announce shutdown strike and protest for indefinite period and the officials concerned would be responsible for the consequences.

Representatives of different political parties also visited the protest camp and condemned the new taxes imposed by the government.

Meanwhile, Haji Sharader Ali Mithayal, the president of his own faction of Markazi Tariq-i-Tajir, and Majeed Rehman, the president of Tajir Iftah Peshawar, in a statement demanded of Peshawar Commissariat Board to review the property tax, water charges, conservancy tax and property tax and provide relief to the business community and residents of the cantonment as well.

They said that different taxes were increased by 900 per cent. They urged the executive officers of CRB to include representatives of traders in the official committees to resolve these issues amicably. — Bureau Report

Court seeks govt's response in Eid declaration case

Petition seeks disqualification of CM, minister on matter

Bureau Report

PESHAWAR: A Peshawar High Court bench on Thursday sought reply from the provincial government over a petition seeking disqualification of the chief minister and information minister over announcement for Eid ul Fitr celebration a day before the conclusion of the fasting month of Ramazan.

Judge Faizullah Khan and Justice Munirul Bihidi issued the order after holding preliminary hearing into the petition of freelance journalist Shafiq ur Rehman, who requested the court to declare that the decision to abruptly terminate the month of fasting in the province was an order violation of articles 2 and 19 of the Constitution, which declare Islam as the state's religion and speak about glory of Islam.

The petitioner said CM Mahmood Khan and information minister Shafiq ur Rehman were responsible for that "unconstitutional act", as they should be disqualified for any conduct of such nature.

He urged the court to direct the provincial governor to inform the federal government about it and seek direction about it under Article 149 of the Constitution. The respondents in the petition are the CM, information minister, governor, and provincial government through advocate general.

Mr Rehman said the information minister officially announced the termination of Ramazan in the province on June 3. He said the fasting month ended in the province on its 28th day in violation of the Quranic Commandment and ironically, the decision about it was made by the provincial government on fast day.

"The entire department of the state, provincial or federal, was involved in the pre-announced sighting of the Shabeival moon," he said.

The petitioner said the minister had literally converted Ramazan into the month of Eid without even thinking about its complications and impact on the federal structure of the Islamic republic, while in a prudent move, the governor and speaker of the provincial assembly did not endorse that decision.

He said the high court should ask the CM if he or the cabinet had discussed after Eid whether the decision was communicated to the governor as required under Article 995 of the Constitution and if the governor informed the federal government about the controversial move or rejected it.

The petitioner said practically, the province was detached from the rest of Pakistan and its sizeable population in particular in Hazara and Bokhara divisions over Eid decision.

He, however, said the move was apparently made without the approval of the governor and that only the governor could state the factual position.

The petitioner said until the facts were clarified, there was a question mark on the oaths taken by the governor, CM and information minister.

Higher rates okayed for Dasu dam land

MANSEERA: The water and power ministry and provincial chief minister have approved increase in the prices of houses and land being acquired for the 4,300 megawatts Dasu hydropower project.

"As we are in the process of acquiring land for Dasu dam, both the federal water and power minister and the chief minister have given approval to increase in land prices. However, the final decision about it will be made by the federal水和power minister," Deputy Commissioner of Upper Kohistan district Hassan Rabbani told a World Bank delegation in his office here on Thursday.

The delegates led by Michael Jon Parsley and Prakash Rath Ferguson visited the dam site and attended a briefing given by the deputy commissioner in his office.

Mr Rabbani said work on Dasu dam for which the World Bank had pledged 16 percent of the total cost was in full swing.

"We have removed all hurdles to the project's smooth execution, while the landowners have been cooperating with us to ease the process of acquisition," he said.

The DC said though the steering committee having the water and power minister and chief minister as members had approved land rate increase, the Executive Committee of National Economic Council would finally decide about it in the next meeting.

"The government wants to expedite work on this mega energy project for which the hiring of additional revenue officials and other staff members is in final stages," he said.

SEALLED: The director food department sealed canteens of two educational institutions in Swabi on Thursday.

Assistant food controller Shaukat Sultan and grain supervisor Shoaib Lodhi paid a surprise visit to various schools and colleges in the city and its suburbs and sealed canteens of Peace Public School and College and Abasian Public School and College for selling unhygienic food items and lack of cleanliness. Mr Sultan said the department had warned many educational institutions to ensure cleanliness to prevent outbreaks.

DIED: A shepherd died of critical injuries after falling into a ditch in Kaseemabad of Kaghan valley on Thursday.

The 35-year-old shepherd, named as Mohammad Ali, grazed his animals in the mountainous areas.

Also in the day, the excise and taxation department sealed many shops in Ghori Kot and other areas of Mansehra city and outskirts over non-payment of taxes. — Correspondent

and excess budget.

He said the speaker had given a ruling on the matter last year, so there was no justification for fresh ruling.

The minister chided the lawyer-as-politician for challenging parliamentary matters in the court saying judiciary and parliament have separate mandates.

Motahar Ali, MPA of KP's Mardan constituency, asked Speaker Masood Ahmad Ghani to kill debate on demands for grant. He said the speaker violated parliamentary norms by exercising powers in absence of the opposition members to prevent debate on the demands for grant. The MPA said the government needed supplementary budget to divert funds from one constituency to another constituency.

KP MPA Niaz Ahmad Abbasi demanded of the government to reconstruct school buildings in Hazara division, which were destroyed by the 2005 earthquake. He said over 3,000 schools had been damaged and yet to be reconstructed.

Salahuddin Mohammad of the ANP and the senator backed by Peshawar Development Authority on 16 link roads in his constituency had long been awaiting completion.

He complained that the government had allocated only Rs1,000 for basic health said in Arakhan area of Peshawar.

Local government minister Shahzad Khan Tarakai in his concluding speech said the successive government had presented supplementary budgets. He dispelled the impression that supplementary budget was unconstitutional.

The minister said the first technical university was being established in KP. He said the deficiency of medicines in hospitals would be addressed. The sitting was adjourned until 10am today (Friday).

Little donation of corneas makes wait of blind people longer

Patients want govt to import corneas through official channels

PESHAWAR: Patients with blind eyes are awaiting corneal transplantation at the city's hospitals to gain vision but donations received from abroad are too little to cater to the needs of all the patients as there is a lack of organs among the local people, according to sources.

Patients also want the government to import corneas through official channels from developed countries to help restore their eyesight.

Majority of the people with their eyes damaged by trauma, pressure cooker explosion, injuries etc have suffered the loss of both eyes at Marghazar Medical Complex and Khyber Teaching Hospital to be transplanted with corneas but the ophthalmologists performing the procedures receive small quantity of corneas compared to the number of

patients.

Since the establishment of Medical Transplantation Regulatory Authority, corneal transplants have taken momentum but shortage of corneas has been affecting those waiting to get them for transplant.

"In past one year, we have received 173 corneas donated by Association of Physicians of Pakistan, Descent of North America (APPNA) which were transplanted in blind people, including 45 children, free of cost," Dr Yasin Murad, the assistant professor at Pakistan Institute of Community Ophthalmology (PIOCO), said.

He said that there are around 350 persons waiting for their turn to undergo corneal transplants but the local ophthalmologists were hesitant to use the same because of the quality.

Dr Prof Ziauddin Iqbal at LRH said they had operated upon 500 patients and 300 others awaited their turn for corneal transplants.

Prof Ziauddin Iqbal, former president of Ophthalmological Society of Pakistan, said that Sri Lanka was also supplying grafts but the local ophthalmologists were hesitant to use the same because of the quality.

Sri Lanka is famous for supplying free corneas but now it has been commercialised completely, he said.

He said that people could get free corneal transplants if they had Zaidat Maal funds only at the government hospital. He said that cost in private sector for quality cornea was Rs20,000, that was not affordable for most of the

list of patients was increasing speedier than the supplies.

At the ophthalmology department of KTPH, where 200 persons have got free transplants in last one year, 400 others are waiting to be able to regain vision. The supply is still less than demand.

"So many letters have been received by KTPH from doctors in other cities of the country to get training under the transplant surgeons," Zaman Shah, assistant professor, told Dawn.

Prof Ziauddin Iqbal at LRH said they had operated upon 500 patients and 300 others awaited their turn for corneal transplants.

Prof Ziauddin Iqbal, former president of Ophthalmological Society of Pakistan, said that Sri Lanka was also supplying grafts but the local ophthalmologists were hesitant to use the same because of the quality.

Sri Lanka is famous for supplying free corneas but now it has been commercialised completely, he said.

He said that people could get free corneal transplants if they had Zaidat Maal funds only at the government hospital. He said that cost in private sector for quality cornea was Rs20,000, that was not affordable for most of the

patients.

"We have requested some charity organisations to send more donations to Khyber Pakhtunkhwa after infrastructure for corneal transplants," said Prof Ziauddin.

The KTPH, which has received recognition in LRH, KTH, HMC and two private hospitals for corneal transplants, has planned to carry out advocacy in favour of organ donations among the council members.

However, it is short of funds to continue its campaign.

The experts said that progressive training in cornea by Khyber Medical University or College of Physicians and Surgeons Pakistan should further develop specialties of organ transplants. They said that 16 organ transplants were conducted worldwide and they needed small speeches regarding transplantation by religious scholars to convince people for donation and control and prevent blindness.

"As far as corneal transplants are concerned, these are different from other organs as the donor tissue is taken after the death of a person, upon her/his consent in life," said the experts.

Razaar tehsil council okays Rs413m budget

SHARJAH: The Razaar tehsil council approved Rs413-million budget for the fiscal year 2019-20 here on Thursday.

This was the last budget of the council as the local government would complete its constitutional tenure in August. Both the treasury and opposition members spoke in favour of allocation of adequate funds and vowed that the development funds would be equally distributed among the council members.

In the budget, Rs289.3 million has been allocated for development work in the tehsil. Similarly, the non-development budget stood at Rs10.5 million while Rs1.5 million was available for implementation of ongoing projects.

Addressing the session, tehsil nazim Ghulam Haqqani said it was the responsibility of provincial government to provide the council with funds as soon as possible because they wanted to complete various projects in their respective areas.

He said that the previous provincial government of PTI had failed to release the required funds to those districts and tehsil governments who did not belong to the ruling party.

SEALED: The district administration here on Thursday sealed four nurseries and polythene bags in Gadoon Awami Industrial Estate, according to sources in the local administration.

They said that the raiding party was led by assistant commissioner, Tariq Shahid, Dr Ehsanul.

When contacted, officials in the local administration said that during the raid plastic bags had been seized and factories sealed in Gadoon estate. They said that during the operation Royal Plastic Factory, Mehran Plastic Factory, Star Gold and Marwan Plastic Factory were sealed and about 35 tons of plastic recovered.

They said that warehouses and wholesale shops of plastic bags had been closed down. Meanwhile, the traders here said that if the government wanted to fully enforce the ban on polythene bags it should give an alternative solution. — Correspondent

"I got excited when I saw so many story books here. I selected


some story books and few books of Allama Iqbal's poetry which I have been longing to read them in my free time," said Hayat, a student of a private school.
